the United States of America, to be paid to the said
County of Cambria, or their successors; to which payment
well and truly to be made, we do bind ourselves, our
heirs, executors and administrators, and every of them,
firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals and
dated this day of December, A.D., 1907.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, that, whereas,
certain inhabitants of the Township of Croyle, said
County, have petitioned the Court of Quarter Sessions
for viewers to lay out a public road, beginning at a
point at the line of the Borough of South Fork, in said
County, at Grant Street, and ending at a point on the
Frankstown road, at or near the farm of Leon Smay, in
said Township. Now, if the Court should so order and
direct that the petitioners aforesaid shall pay into the
County Treasurer the pay of the viewers for viewing said
road, as provided for by the Act of April 4, A.D., 1907,
and the said petitioners shall comply with the said order
of Court and pay into the County Treasury the pay of the
viewers aforesaid, then this obligation shall be void, else
to be and remain in full force and virtue.

D. 190 **8** , before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of....**Croyle**....., in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a.....**public**.....road or highway, to lead from ..a point at the line of the Borough of South Fork in said County, at Grant street, and ending at a point on the Frankstown Road, at or near the farm of Leon Smay in Croyle Township.....

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint ..**Harry Shaffer**.....surveyor, and.....

..**John G. Broad and Lyman Sherbine**.....viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President Judge of

We, the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order,
do report: That in pursuance thereof, after having been
severally duly sworn according to law, all the viewers
appointed by the said order viewed the ground proposed
for the within mentioned road, and the undersigned, being
all of the said viewers, do agree that there is occasion
for a road, as desired by the petitioners, and that the
same is necessary for a public road. And having had
respect to the shortest distance and the best ground
for such road, we have laid it out in such manner as
shall do the least injury to private property, and, as
far as practicable, agreeably to the desire of the
petitioners, and do return for public use the following
described road, to-wit:-

Beginning at a point on Grant Street at the line of
the Borough of South Fork, in the said County; thence
south sixty-seven degrees and ten minutes, east three
hundred feet to a point; thence south sixty-nine degrees
and five minutes east, two hundred fifty-three feet to
a point; thence south sixty degrees and thirty minutes
east, three hundred feet to a point; thence south sixty-
six degrees east, three hundred sixty-two feet to a
point; thence south fifty-three degrees east, four
hundred twenty-one feet to a point; thence south fifty-
nine degrees and fifty minutes east, four hundred fifty-
six feet to a point; thence north seventy-six degrees
and thirty-five minutes east, four hundred eighteen feet
to a point; thence north eighty-three degrees and

thirty minutes east, four hundred eighty feet to a point; thence south eighty-six degrees east, two hundred thirty-three feet to a point; thence south sixty-eight degrees and five minutes east, three hundred ninety-one feet to a point; thence north eighty degrees and thirty minutes east, one thousand one hundred ten feet to a point; thence north eighty-four degrees and five minutes east, eight hundred thirty feet to a point; thence south eighty-five degrees east, one thousand seven hundred sixty-six feet to a point on the Frankstown Road, at or near the farm of Leon Smay in Croyle Township, said County; said road being at an elevation not exceeding five degrees.

The undersigned further report that they procured from all the owners of the lands over which the said road passes, releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening or using of the said road, except from Alex Story.

We further report that before the said view public notice of the time and place of meeting of the viewers was given by advertisements put up at three of the most public places in the vicinity, ten days before said meeting; printed notice of said meeting was given to the Supervisors of the Township of Croyle ten days before the said meeting, and to the Commissioners of Cambria County ten days before the said meeting.

We hereunto annex a plot or draft of the said road as laid out, stating the courses and distances, and

noting briefly the improvements through which the same
passes, and herewith return the releases obtained and
a copy of said notices.
