That a public road beginning at a
point at Beech Barner School House, on
the public road from Coalport to Glas-
gow, to a point at or near the resi-
dence of J. D. Glass, on the public road
from Golden Timber to Glasgow, all in
said Township of Reade, laid out by due
proceedings in this Court, at No. 5
September Sessions, 1809, Road Packet,
No. 5, page 215, was duly confirm-
ed by the Court, on ~~the~~ 12th day of March,
1808, and has been opened in part, to
wit, from the point of ending at or near
the residence of J. D. Glass, to a point on
the public road from Glasgow to Coal-
port, by way of Elintan, and remain-
der of said road, laid out as aforesaid,
to wit, from the point last above men-
tioned to Beech Barner School House
aforesaid, has not been opened,
and is useless, inconvenient and
burdensome, as few, if any, per-
sons live along its route, and it
is not necessary for public use.

Wherefore your petitioners pray
 the Court to inquire of the premises
 and to vacate the unopened part of
 said Road as aforesaid, and for that
 purpose to appoint three persons
 qualified according to law, to view
 said Road and make report of their
 proceedings at the next term of this
 Court.

To the Honorable Francis J. O'Connor, President Judge of the Court
of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania:-

We, the undersigned viewers appointed by the annexed order to view and vacate a road in Reade Township, Beginning at a point, near the Beech Corner School House, on the public road from Coalport to Glasgow, and ending at a point on the public road from Flinton to Glasgow, near the residence of B. F. Bowman, respectfully report:

That due public notice of the time and place of meeting having been given, and also, notice served upon supervisors of said township, properly attested copies of said notice being hereto attached, all the viewers appointed by said order met at the residence of J. I. Glass, in said Township, on August 20th, 1909, at 10 o'clock, A. M., and after being severally sworn or affirmed to perform their duties impartially, and to the best of their judgment, proceeded to the duties of their appointment.

After going carefully over the ground and considering the desires of the inhabitants of said Township, we decided that the road is not necessary for public use, and would be useless, inconvenient and burdensome upon the tax-payers of said Township. We, therefore, have vacated the following described road: Beginning at a point on the public road, leading from Coalport to Glasgow, near the Beech Corner School House; thence South six degrees thirty minutes West one hundred and forty-six (146) feet; thence South thirty-nine degrees thirty minutes West five hundred and fourteen (514) feet; thence South forty-nine degrees thirty minutes West one hundred and three feet; thence South twenty degrees East one hundred and eighty-five (185) feet; thence South forty degrees East two hundred and twenty-four (224) feet; thence South thirty-one degrees East one hundred and ninety-two (192) feet; thence South six degrees West one hundred and forty-one (141) feet; thence South four hundred and thirty-five (435) feet; thence South five degrees West two hundred and eight (208) feet to the public road, leading from Flinton

to Glasgow, Said road passes through land of Samuel Hagerty, N. Y. Lithgow, Bowman & Miller, and Amos Glass. A draft is hereto attached and made part of this report.

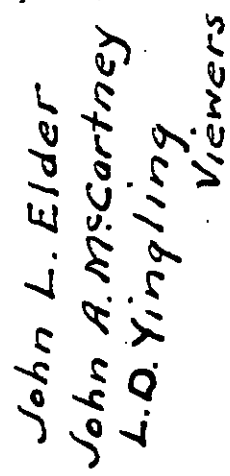

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to ^{vacate} view and lay-out the same ac-
cording to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint
John S. Elder surveyor, and

John A. McBarney and L. A. Yingling
viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they ^{vacate} view the same, and
shall agree that there is ^{no} occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay-out the same, having
respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do
the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the
petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions
to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or
private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to
the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
