President Judge of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County:

We, the subscribers, persons appointed by the Court to view the place proposed for a bridge in the withinlorder mentioned, respectfully report:

That having been present at the view of the place proposed for the bridge within mentioned, and having all been first severally sworn or affirmed, in pursuance of said order, having given due public notice as required by law, we viewed the premises aforesaid and are of opinion that 'a bridge over Chest Creek, at the place where the public highway leading from Eckenrode's Mill to Patton Borough crosses the said Creek, is necessary, and that the erection of such a bridge would be attended with more expense than it is reasonable the said Townships of Carroll and Clearfield should bear.

We also further report: That after proper examination, we are of opinion that a change in the location of such bridge would be an improvement and more advantageous in that it would do away with a grade crossing over the Cambria and Clearfield Division of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, and therefore have located the said bridge at a point across the said Creek two hundred and thirty-five feet further down the said Chest Creek, and therefore report that the route of said road should be changed in the following manner, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the road leading to Eckenrode's Mills four hundred and fifty-three feet from the West end of the old bridge thence along the present road North twenty degrees East two hundred and forty-one feet to a post; thence continuing along the said road North thirteen degrees thirty minutes East one hundred and twenty-eight feet to a post in line of the Cambria and Clearfield Division

of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company; thence still continuing by same North thirty degrees West eighty-four feet to the old bridge; thence still by same North twenty-eight degrees West eighty-three feet to a post; thence North nineteen degrees thirty minutes East fifty feet to a post; thence North seventy-three degrees thirty minutes East three hundred and sixty feet to a post in public road leading from Patton to Chest Springs, should be vacated, and supplied with the following road; to-wit:

Beginning at the same point in the road leading to Eckenrode's Mills four hundred and fifty-three feet from the West end of the old bridge; thence through lands of H. J. Link North twenty-six degrees West two hundred and ninety-eight feet to the proposed new bridge over the said Chest Creek; thence through lands of Henry Litzinger North twenty-one degrees fifteen minutes West one hundred and sixty-seven feet to a post; thence continuing through lands of the said Henry Litzinger North Sixteen degrees thirty minutes West two hundred and ninety-two feet to a post; thence continuing throught same North eight degrees West fifty-eight feet to a post; thence by an over-head bridge, to be crected, as we are informed, by the Cambria and Clearfield Division of the Pennsylvania Railroad Company, North fourteen degrees thirty minutes West one hundred and ten feet to a post in the public road leading from Patton to Chest Springs.

The undersigned further report: That they endeavored to procure from all the owners of lands over which the said road passes, releases in writing of all claims to damages that may arise from opening the same, but failed to procure such release from H. J. Link, and therefore having taken into consideration the advantages to be derived by the said H. J. Link from the road passing through his lands, they have assessed the damages sustained by the said H. J. Link at fifty dollars. And Henry Litzinger, through whose land the road passes, informed the viewers that he did not desire any damages whatsoever.

We further report: That before the said view public notice was given to all parties in interest according to law, and we annex a plot or draft of said road as laid out, showing the courses and distances, together with the improvements through which the same passes with a description and draft of the road vacated, and showing the location of the old and proposed new bridge.

"It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."
