OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBERIA COUNTY, IN THE STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA.

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Township
of Carroll, in said County and State, respectfully represents: That
they labor under great inconvenience for want of a public road to
lead from a point on what is known as the "Ridge" road between the
Borough of Carrolltown and the Cross Roads, and to end at another
point on said "Ridge" road near the line of land of Michael Galus-
check. The termini of the proposed new road is as follows:

The place of beginning is found by starting at a point at the
intersection of the Cross Roads where a road leads off from the
"Ridge" road in the direction of St. Boniface, and another road leads
off from the "Ridge" road in the direction of Patton, and extending
thence by the line of said "Ridge" road the following three
courses and distances, viz: South forty-four degrees fifteen min-
utes West a distance of four hundred and five feet to a point, South
thirty degrees thirty minutes West a distance of five hundred and
forty-three feet to a point, and South fifty-six degrees forty-five
minutes West a distance of one hundred and fifty-eight and five-
tenth feet to the place of beginning of said proposed new road.

The proposed ending of said road is at a point on said "Ridge"
road about two hundred feet South of the line of land of Michael
Galuscheck (formerly William and Margaret Switzler) and is distant
about thirty-one hundred and ninety feet Northward from said point
of intersection of the Cross Roads.

They therefore pray your Honor to appoint three persons properly
qualified to view the premises and report to the Court upon the
expediency of laying out said new road. And they will etc.

Huber ...viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
