REPORT OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE M. B. STEPHENS, PRESIDENT HUDGE OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA.:

We, the indersigned, members of the Board of Viewers, appointed by your Hono-rable Court to view the ground for a proposed road in Jackson Township, this County, as shown by the order of Court hereto attached, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers to the County Commissiders of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of Jackson Township by having them accept service of notices, which are hereto attached, and to the public by printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the site or termini of the proposed road: all of us met in accordance with the notice given, and having first been duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment, faithfully impartially and to the best of our ability, we viewed the premises and are of opinion that the same is necessary for a public road, for the convenience of the Citizens of the Township of Jackson and of the traveling public generally and therefore we proceeded to law out the same according to the following courses and distances- which are also shown on the plot or draft of the said road as laid out, which is hereto attached and made a part of this report, and returned for public use--viz:
