Campbell.....viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road: they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."



R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

TO THE HONORABLE M. B. STEPHENS, PRESIDENT JUDGE OF
THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PA.:

We, the undersigned, members of the Board of Viewers, appointed by your Honorable Court to view the ground for a proposed road in Jackson Township, this County, as shown by the order of Court hereto attached, respectfully report:-

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the Viewers to the County Commissioners of Cambria County and to the Supervisors of Jackson Township by having them accept service of notices, which are hereto attached, and to the public by printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the site or termini of the proposed road: all of us met in accordance with the notice given, and having first been duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment, faithfully and impartially and to the best of our ability, we viewed the premises and are of opinion that the same is necessary for a public road, for the convenience of the Citizens of the Township of Jackson and of the traveling public generally, and therefore we proceeded to lay out the same according to the following courses and distances- which are also shown on the plot or draft of the said road as laid out, which is hereto attached and made a part of this report, and returned for public use--viz:

Beginning near the residence of M. W. Devlin in Jackson Township at a point on the public road leading from St. Paul's Lutheran Church to the Village of Vinco, thence South forty degrees East two hundred twelve feet, thence South twenty

degrees East five hundred fifty-three feet, thence South thirty degrees East two hundred seventy feet, thence South forty-three degrees forty five minutes East two hundred four feet, thence South sixteen degrees East one hundred eighty five feet, thence South sixty-four degrees forty-five minutes East one hundred seventy four feet, thence South fifty degrees East, two hundred eighty seven feet, thence South thirty five degrees thirty minutes East two hundred ninety five feet, thence South forty-two degrees thirty minutes West ninety-one feet, thence South seventy four degrees forty-five minutes East one hundred thirty one feet, thence North sixty-eight degrees East ninety feet to a point on the Southern Cambria Railroad at the Vinco Road Station: The same being laid out for the whole distance through woodland all, or nearly all of which belongs to M. W. Devlin, to whom, owing to the character of the land through which the road as laid out passes, the Viewers assess no damages.
