To the Honorable M. B. Stephens, President Judge of the
Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pa.:-

We, the undersigned, Members of the Board of Viewers
of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court to view the
site and determine as to the necessity of erecting guard rails
along a certain piece of road in Conemaugh Township, Cambria County,
Pa. as shown by the order of Court, hereto attached, respectfully
report.

That having given due notice of the view and of the time
and place of meeting of the Viewers, to the County Commissioners
and to the Supervisors of Conemaugh Township, by having them
accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the public by
printed handbills posted in public and conspicuous places, at and
near the termini and along the route of the said piece of road;
All of us met in accordance with the notices so given and having
been first duly qualified according to law to faithfully, justly,
impartially and to the best of our judgment, perform the duties of
our appointment: We viewed the site and are of opinion that guard
rails along the said piece of road are necessary for the proper
protection and safety of the traveling public. Further we are of
opinion that the erection and construction of the guard rails
would necessitate the expenditure of more than is reasonable the
taxpayers of the Township should be required to bear and therefore
we recommend that the expense of erecting the same shall be borne
by the County.

A plot or draft showing the location and the courses and
distances of the said road is hereto attached and made a part of
this report: Said draft showing a piece of road beginning at the

line of the Borough of Franklin and running thence into Conemaugh Township the following courses and distances on the road leading from the said Borough of Franklin to the Gossard Schoolhouse, North 63 1/4 degrees East 208 feet, thence North 78 degrees East 518 feet, thence South 79 degrees East 676 feet, thence South 66 degrees East 582 feet, thence South 78 degrees East 250 feet, thence South 81 degrees 20 minutes East 311 feet, thence South 77 1/2 degrees East 412 feet, thence North 88 1/2 degrees East 703 feet, thence South 89 1/2 degrees East 264 feet, thence North 80 1/2 degrees East 370 feet, thence South 6 degrees East 223 feet, thence South 52 degrees 20 minutes East 814 feet, thence South 67 1/2 degrees East 270 feet, thence South 74 degrees East 527 feet, thence South 55 degrees East 337 feet, thence South 27 1/4 degrees East 224 feet, thence South 56 1/2 degrees East 237 feet, thence South 69 1/2 degrees East 358 feet, thence South 73 degrees East 431 feet, thence South 62 degrees East 561 feet, thence South 75 3/4 degrees East 188 feet, thence North 74 1/2 degrees East 331 feet, thence North 62 degrees East 358 feet, to a private road leading off to the right, at 110 feet Southwest of David Shephard's Mail box.

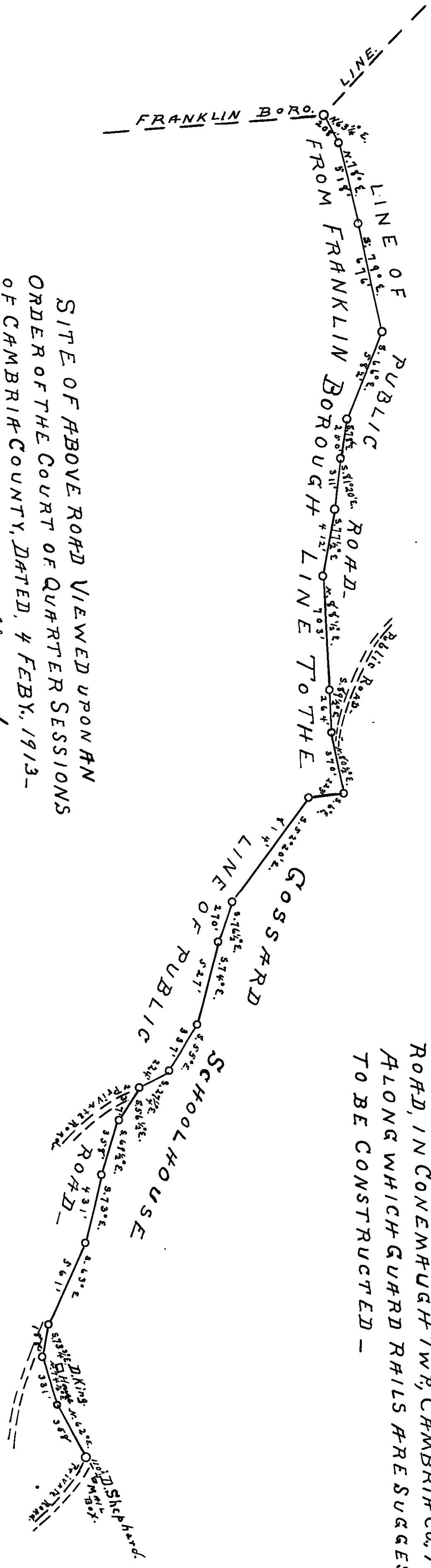

SPECIFICATIONS FOR GUARD RAILS.

Length of posts not less than 6 ft. 3 ft. 4 in. above ground, level of road, and depth not less than 3 ft. in the ground, according to location, etc. Posts to be second locust, 6 in. in diameter, at top or well and with bark off. Distance between posts or span, 6 ft. center to center.

Top rail 4 x 4 in., surfaced ^{and} ~~and~~ ~~smoothed~~, attached in top of post and fastened with iron strap 5/16 in. thick, and 1-1/2 in. wide.

Bottom rail to be 1-1/2 x 3 in., pointed and inserted in post, full dimensions.

Posts to be No. 1 White Oak, ^{not chestnut} height of fence, 3-1/2 ft in clear this to be received in two forms:

One with post set with concrete base 6 in. deep on outside of post.

D. 1903, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of ~~Conemaugh~~ in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a barrier upon the public road or highway, ~~to lead from~~ hereinafter mentioned, the expense of erecting the same is more than the the said Township can reasonably bear; the said portion of the aforesaid highway needing a barrier being entirely within the limits of the said Township, designated thus: On certain public road leading from the Boro of Franklin to the Gossard Schoolhouse. Said barriers to begin at said Boeough line and end at the David Shephard mail box, a distance of ninety-five hundred feet (9500).

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint Alfred Shoemaker surveyor, and

Fred. J. Custer and Adam Shumann viewers, to view the ground proposed for said barrier and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such barrier, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a barrier and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

TO THE HONORABLE MARLIN BINGHAM STEPHENS, PRESIDENT JUDGE:

The petition of the undersigned Supervisors and residents of the Township of Conemaugh, County aforesaid, respectfully represents:

That there is need for a barrier upon a public highway between the points hereinafter mentioned; the expense of erecting the same is more than the Township can reasonably bear; the said portions of the aforesaid highway needing a barrier being entirely within the limits of the said Township, designated thus: On certain public road leading from the Borough of Franklin to the Gossard Schoolhouse. Said barriers to begin at said Borough line and end at the David Shephard mail box, a distance of ninety-five hundred (9500) feet.

Wherefore, your petitioners pray the Court to order a view in the manner provided for in the case of roads to view the premises and determine whether or not such guards or barriers are necessary, and whether or not the same would be too expensive for said Township to erect and maintain; and report to make thereon as provided by the Act of Assembly of May 25, 1878, P. L. 150, and its supplements and amendments.
