That your petitioner presented his petition to this Court to the Number and Sessions above, asking for the appointment of viewers to view and lay out a road to lead from the barn erected on his farm in the Township of Barr, in said County, to a point on the road leading from Nicktown to Ebensburg, on line of land of estate of Nicholas Lambour, deceased, and the Northern corner of land of W.J. Pfeister..

That in pursuance of said petition the Court appointed S.E. Dickey, Adam Shuman, and F.J. Custer viewers, who made report to said Court on the first Monday in June, laying out for private use a road as described in said report and as shown upon a draft thereto attached..

That the road as laid out by said viewers is not located at such a place as is contemplated by the law relating to the laying out of private roads, but is so located as to be inconvenient, expensive and burdensome, not only to your petitioner, but to the persons through whose land the same is laid out. Your petitioner further represents that the amount of damages awarded by said viewers is grossly in excess of the damages which will be suffered by the owners of the lands traversed by the road, as laid out..

Your petitioner therefore, showing that he is a party in interest, prays the Court to appoint reviewers to view and lay out a road between the points above mentioned, and to report according to law. And he will etc.

## Report of Viewers.

To the Honorable , the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order, for the purposes therein set forth, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers, to the Commissioners of Cambria County and to the parties interested, all of us met at the place appointed in accordance with the notices so given, and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment according to the best of our judgment, skill and ability: We viewed the premises and are of opinion that there is occasion for a private road to lead from the premises of John J. Beckel to a point on the Ebensburg and Nicktown road, and that the road as laid out by the Viewers is the most feasible and practical that, under the circumstances can be had and therefore we recommend a private road to begin at the barn of John J. Beckel and take the following courses and distances, viz: North eighty-seven degrees twenty-five minutes East five hundred ninety feet, North thirty-eight and one half degrees East three hundred twenty three feet, North five degrees forty minutes East eight hundred eighty three feet, North fifty nine degrees forty minutes West twenty two hundred sixty feet, and North five degrees East seven hundred ten feet to the public road; passing over the Easterly end of Henry Bechels farm and thence along the line between said Bechel and the Nicholas Lambour Est. and thence over the said Lambour Est. to the township road. As is shown on the attached plot or draft herewith returned and made a part of this report.

The Viewers having failed to secure releases of damages from the parties through and over whose land the proposed road as laid out passes, have assessed damages as follows; To Henry Bechel the sum of one hundred seventy five dollars, and to the Nicholas Labour Est. the sum of fifty dollars for the damage occasioned by the opening maintaining and using of said road.
