

Report of Viewers.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court upon the attached order for the purposes therein stated, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of Jackson Township, by having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the proposed new road: All of us met at the place appointed in accordance with the notices given, and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment according to the best of our judgment, skill and ability: We viewed the premises and are of opinion that a public road in the township of Jackson, between the termini indicated on the attached order is necessary for the convenience of the public and therefore recommend a road beginning at a point, in Finn Town, just West of the Village of Nant-Y-Glo, in Jackson township, 2829 feet from the intersection of the Ebensburg and Blacklick Branch of the P.R.R. with the public road leading from the Stone Pike in Jackson township, through Nant-Y-Glo, to the Clay Pike in Blacklick township; as indicated on the plot or draft hereto attached, made a part of this report and herewith returned for public use; and from thence takes the following courses and distances, viz (reversing the courses as noted on attached draft) North 20 degrees West 468 feet, North 12 degrees West 376 feet, North 38 1/4°

West 125 feet, North 29 1/2° West 229 feet, North 56 1/4° West 308 feet, North 51 3/4° West 242 feet, North 51 1/2° West 237 feet, North 47 1/2° West 224 feet, North 36 1/2° West 142 feet, North 32 1/2° West 249 feet, North 43° West 332 feet, North 58 3/4° West 306 feet, South 88° West 468 feet, South 85 1/2° West 407 feet, South 82° West 538 feet and North 69 1/2° West 480 feet to a point on the public road leading from the Stone Pike to Twin Rocks, 5405 feet Southward from the intersection of this road with the above named branch of the P. R. R. at Twin Rocks Station. Said road being laid out through uncleared land from Finn Town to point of draft marked "A" and from this point follows a private road to the place of ending.

The viewers being of opinion that no damages will be sustained have assessed no damages, except to the Thos. Davis Heirs, to whom we assess forty dollars damages.

Shoemaker.....surveyor, and..... Fred. J. Custer...and George K. Shryock..... viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
