IN AND FOR CAMBRIA COUNTY IN PLAT BOOK 1 AT PAGE 70.

WHEREAS, a certain plan of lots for the Village of Longtown (formerly McClainville) in the Township of Susquehanna, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania was recorded in the office for the recording of deeds in and for Cambria County In Plat Book 1 at page 70;

WHEREAS, by said plan a certain Avenue known as Long Avenue was dedicated to the use of the public and said Avenue has been used continuously by the public for a period of twenty-one (21) years and upwards;

WHEREAS, the said Avenue was never accepted by the Board of Supervisors of Susquehanna Township as a public highway;

WHEREAS, the said Avenue which is located as aforesaid in the said Village of Longtown (formerly McClainville) in said Township of Susquehanna and said Village is well populated and contains many homes and buildings;

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Susquehanna Township are desirous of accepting as a public highway the said Long Avenue.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the unanimous vote of the said Board of Supervisors that the said Long Avenue which has a width of 50 feet, be hereby accepted by the said Board of Supervisors as a public highway, said Avenue being more specifically described in the plan of lots of the Village of Longtown (formerly McClainville) which has been recorded in the office for the recording of deeds, etc. in and for the County of Cambria in Plat Book 1 at page 70.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge; to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

We, the viewers appointed by the above named Court to view the location and report on the advisability of providing certain citizens and taxpayers of Susquehanna Township, in Cambria County adjacent to Barnesboro Borough, with badly needed road facilities, respectfully report as follows:-

That after giving full publicity of the view to the public interested, by notices posted on the proposed view, on the premises and throughout the district and by advertisement in the Barnesboro Star, a weekly newspaper of general circulation and by personal solicitation to the County Commissioners and the Supervisors of Susquehanna Township, we met as advertised, on Saturday ~~October~~ 8th., at 10 o'clock A. M. as advertised to perform the duties of our appointment.

We found that approximately twenty taxpayers of Susquehanna Township, in Cambria County, adjacent to Longtown, or living in it, have established modern homes and a very creditable addition to Barnesboro. While doing this they have continued for perhaps fifty years to pay taxes in Susquehanna Township without receiving any road benefits. For they present their case and ask that the Supervisors of Susquehanna Township, Cambria County, make them a suitable road for a distance of perhaps a thousand feet from the boundary of Barnesboro to the last mail box of the taxpayers presenting the petition.

The case presents a well justified complaint and the opinion of the viewers is Unanimous that this piece of public Road should be provided for them without delay. The cost will be very low and there are to be no claims for property damages.

## NICKTOWN SOLDIERS WOUNDED

Two members of Co. C, 110th Infantry, Pennsylvania National Guard, from the Nicktown district were wounded in France, according to word received by relatives.

Both boys trained at Indiantown Gap, Camp Livingston, La., Camp Gordon Johnston, Fla., and Camp Pickett, Va. They were sent to England and trained there for several months before going to the battlefield in France.

Both have been evacuated to a hospital in England and are in the same ward.

### REPORT OF VIEWERS.

We, the viewers appointed by the above named Court to view the location and report on the advisability of providing certain citizens and taxpayers of Susquehanna Township, in Cambria County adjacent to Barnesboro Borough, with badly needed road facilities, respectfully report as follows:-

That after giving full publicity of the view to the public interested, by notices posted on the proposed view on the premises and throughout the district and by advertisement in the Barnesboro Star, a weekly newspaper of general circulation and by personal solicitation to the County Commissioners and the Supervisors of Susquehanna Township, we met & as advertised, on Saturday September 24th., at 10 o'clock A. M. as advertised to perform the duties of our appointment.

We found that approximately twenty taxpayers of Susquehanna Township, in Cambria County, adjacent to Longtown, or living in it, have established modern homes and a very creditable addition to Barnesboro. While doing this they have continued for perhaps fifty years to pay taxes in Susquehanna Township without receiving any road benefits. Now they present their case and ask that the Supervisors of Susquehanna Township, Cambria County, make them a suitable road for a distance of perhaps a thousand feet from the boundary of Barnesboro to the last mail box of the taxpayers presenting the petition.

The case presents a well justified complaint and the opinion of the viewer<sup>s</sup> is Unanimous that this piece of public road should be provided for them without delay. The cost will be very low and there are to be no claims for property damages.
