R E P O R T O F V I E W E R S .

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court; upon the attached order; and directed to view and determine as to the necessity for a public road in the Village of Amsbry, Gallitzin Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and Supervisors of the Township of Gallitzin, by serving notices upon them; a copy of which is hereto attached; and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at the termini and along the route of the proposed new road as required by the Act of the General Assembly and the rules of court:

All of us met at the time and place appointed in accord with the notices served and posted as aforesaid, and having each been duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability; we proceeded to view the said premises and the location for a public road and are all of the opinion that the road as prayed for is necessary for the accomodation and convenience of the public and particularly for a considerable number of the tax payers of Gallitzin Township and residence of the Village of Amsbry.

Accordingly we proceeded to lay out the said road, a plot or draft of which is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

Said road as petitioned for and recommended by the undersigned viewers appointed by your honorable Court takes the following courses and distances, viz:

Beginning at the easterly side of the concrete bridge over the Clearfield Creek adjacent to the Village of Amsbry and extending thence south sixty-one degrees thirty minutes east one hundred forty-two feet; south seventy-five degrees east ninety-eight feet; north eighty-one degrees forty minutes east eighty-nine and two tenths feet; north eighty-three degrees ten minutes east two hundred eleven and four tenths feet; south thirty- two degrees five minutes east four hundred sixty-two feet; south twenty-one degrees west thirty-eight and six tenths feet; north seventy-five degrees ten minutes west sixty-five feet; north sixty-nine degrees west seventy-seven feet; north thirty-nine degrees fifteen minutes west one hundred sixty feet; north fifty-one degrees ten minutes west one hundred twenty-eight feet; north thirty-three degrees fifteen minutes west one hundred eighty-four feet, passing the Methodist Church, post office, community hall, public school building, and numerous dwelling houses as more particularly shown on the draft hereto attached. As no damages will be sustained by reason of the laying out and opening of the new road none have been awarded by the viewers.

NOTE: It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.
