

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fall to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtanied, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefily the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sess - ions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your Honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating certain portions of public road abandoned by the Department of Highways as parts of State Highway Route No.11034 after said Route No. 11034 had been relocated, respectfully report:

That having given due and legal notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of the Township of Cambria, and having had them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminii and along the route of the portions of public road desired to be vacated: All of us met at the time and place appointed and as specified on the notices served and posted as aforesaid and having gone over and carefully viewed the portions of abandoned highway indicated on the above referred to order of the Court and are each of the following opinion, viz:

That the whole of the first section of abandoned highway beginning at a point at or near the entrance to the Pittsburgh and Allegheny Home for the Friendless-indicated on the attached draft as "A" and the point indicated as "C" should be vacated as a public road; but that the portion thereof between points "A" & "B" should be left open as a private road for the use and convenience of W. J. Neadeau and the representatives and employees of the Borough of Ebensburg.

That the whole of the second section of the abandoned highway Route No. 11034 between "D" and "L" on the attached draft should be vacated as a public road; except that portion between points indicated on attached draft between "E" and "F".

That the portions between "D" and "E", between "F" and "G" and between "I" and "J" should be left open as private roads for the use and accommodation of the respective property owners abutting these particular sections of road.

Said two sections of abandoned State Highway Route No. 11034 recently turned back to the Supervisors of Cambria Township, as township roads take the following courses and distances, as are more clearly indicated on the draft which is hereto attached and made a part of this report - The first section beginning at "A" and extending N 39 E 193' N 38 E 301.4'N 48 50'E 200'N 31 45'E 200'N 27 30'E 431' N225 E 721.4' N 4 30'E 587' to "C".

The second section beginning at "D" and extending as follows N. 18 55' E 935' N 19 E.1454' N 19 30' E 496' N 2 45' E 651' N 1 E 286.4' N 28 30' E 378' N 29 50' E 762' N 19 E.421' N.1 30' E 1020.6' N. 250' N 1 E 1870' N 2 E 905' N 52 30' W 1021' N 51 30' W 574' N 28 W 280' and N 56 30' E 512 to "L" at the northerly end of the portion of State Highway Route 11034, in Cambria Township abandoned by reason of the relocation of portions of said State Route 11034.

The viewers desire to recommend that there is urgent need for guard rails near a point immediately northward from phint "D" on draft, where the newly located portion of State Highway Route No. 11034 diverges from the abandoned portion of State Route No. 11034, where an approach to the lane leading to the farm of Mrs. Philip Illig has been made along said newly constructed State Highway.

The portion of section two of the above referred to pieces of public road which is herein recommended to be left as a town-ship road between points indicated as "E" and "F" will connect with the newly located Route No. 11034 by a forty foot road to be constructed over a strip of ground acquired by the Township

of Cambria from Paul T. Illig and from Edward A. Illig and Bertha A. Illig, his wife, for the purpose of a more convenient outlet for some five resident property owners living along the portion of road left as a township road.
