TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The petition of E. Paul Hoover, William A. Westrick and H. P. Dishart, Road Supervisors of the Township of East Carroll, in said County of Cambria, respectfully represents:

- l. This petition is presented under a Rule 301 of the Rules of the Courts of Oyer and Terminer and Quarter Sessions of the openion of the County of Cambria aforesaid, which provides, inter alia, that viewers will not be appointed for the purpose of laying out, relocating or vacating any public highway within the County of Cambria * * *, excepting after issuance of a rule upon the County Commissioners of said County to appear and show cause, if any they have, why viewers should not be appointed, and the service of such Rule along with a copy of the petition must be made upon the County Commissioners not less than ten days before the return day.
- 2. Certain public roads within the territory now comprised in said Township of East Carroll were laid out by the authority of the Court long since, and by reason of improvement thereof by the substitution therefor of State Highways or State improved highways, making certain changes therein, portions of said public roads have become and are wholly useless to the traveling public.
 - 3. The roads in question are as follows:
- (a) Public highway leading from a point at the southern extremity of the Borough of Carrolltown where said road intersects National and Pennsylvania Highway Route No. 219 known locally as the road from Carrolltown to Ebensburg, and extending thence to the Township line between the Township of East Carroll and the Township of Allegheny between Bradley Junction and Eckenrodes Mill.

Certain portions of the road above described have been superseded through the straightening thereof and the elimination of grades so that the same are no longer used, said portions being shown upon the blueprint map of survey by H. F. Dorr attached to this petition and made part hereof, and thereon designated by the figure (1).

- (b). Public Highway leading from Eckenrodes Mill at the township line between the Townships of East Carroll and Clearfield to a point on the public road leading from Carrolltown to Patton, at or near the farm of Emma Thomas, said road being now designated as State Highway Route No. 11041. Two portions of said road above described have been superseded through the straightening thereof and the elimination of grades so that the same are no longer used, said portions being shown upon the blueprint map of survey by H. F. Dorr attached to this petition and made part hereof, and thereon designated by the figures (2) and (3).
- (c). Road leading from Carrolltown to Patton and known as State
 Highway Route No. 11048, and road leading from last mentioned road at farm of
 Harry J. Hoover to public road known as 11049. By reason of recent straightening of the first above mentioned public road, a portion thereof beginning at a
 point on the road leading to Route No. 11049 at land of Harry J. Hoover and
 William J. Hoover, and ending on said Carrolltown-Patton Road, Route No. 11048,
 at land of said William J. Hoover, has been entirely superseded and is no longer
 useful to the traveling public. The portion of the new and superseded road
 involved is shown on said map hereto attached and designated by the figure (4).
- (d). A road leading from the Carrolltown-Patton Road and being known as State Highway 11075 leading to State Highway Route 11049 as mentioned in the last preceding clause where Route 11075 connects with Route 11049 at a point known as Bakers Cross Roads. By reason of the recent straightening of said last mentioned road, two portions thereof have been superseded by the straightened highway and are no longer useful to the traveling public. The portions of said road thus affected are shown on said blueprint hereto attached and identified by the figure (5).

(e). A road leading from Route No. 219, commonly known as the Carrolltown-Ebensburg Road, at a point near the farm of Herman Haas and leading thence to the line between East Carroll Township and Cambria Township. This road has been supplied by a new construction made by the Highway Department and known as Route No. 219. Certain sections of said first mentioned road which is now known as Route 11034 have been superseded and rendered useless to the public by the construction of said new highway known as Route No. 219.

WHEREFORE, the petitioners pray the Court for a Rule upon the County Commissioners of said County of Cambria to appear in said Court and show cause if any they have why viewers should not be appointed for the vacation of several portions of the respective public roads hereinabove designated.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The petition of the undersigned freeholders of the Township of East Carroll, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

- I. That a road has been long since laid out and opened in the Township of East Carroll, in the County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, being known as the Dutch Road, leading from the center of Chest Creek at the Allegheny-East Carroll Township line in a northwesterly direction past the Carrolltown Borough Water Works to the Borough of Carrolltown, where the same ends at State Highway Route No. 62 (Travel Route No. 219), known as the Carrolltown-Ebensburg Road. The improved portion of said Dutch Road is known as State Highway Route No. 11038, Section 2, as shown on the map attached hereto.
- 2. Said road as described in Paragraph 1 of this petition was laid out by a petition to the Court as recorded in Road Docket Vol. 2, page 438, being No. 558, and confirmed by the Court on July 7, 1860. The petition for the laying out of said road did not give a width to the same. See also Road Docket Vol. 2, page 89, No. 100, confirmed by the Court on January 11, 1851.
- 3. By reason of the improvement of said State Highway Route No. 11038, Section 2, between Station No. 107+10 and Station No. 321+0, as shown on the map attached here to and made part hereof, and by reason of the straightening of the road, taking out certain sharp curves and otherwise improving said highway, certain portions of said road as described in Paragraph 1 of this petition have become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the taxpayers and citizens of the Township of East Carroll, and the undersigned freeholders seek to have it vacated.

4. The portions of said road sought to be vacated are described as follows, the point of beginning and the point of ending of each of said portions being located with respect to the Pennsylvania Railroad line leading from Bradley Junction to the Borough of Patton, which said railroad intersects the aforesaid highway known as the Dutch Road, and said point of intersection being 749.6 feet from the center line of a concrete and steel bridge crossing the Chest Creek. The points of ending of each of said portions are likewise identified by their respective distances from said intersecting railroad.

We, the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the attached order of the above Court, to view and determine whether certain portions of Public Hoad along State Highway Route No. 11038, in East Carroll Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, should be vacated because of changes and improvements made by the State Highway Department making such portions of public road useless and burdensome to maintain, respectfully report:

That we have been duly sworm as members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, as attested by the records of said Court; that due notice was given to the public at least ten days prior to the holding of said View of the time, place and purpose of meeting to view the road in question, by the posting of notices at the termini of said portions of road, along the route, and at points adjacent thereto, and by the serving of notices on the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of East Carroll Township, copies of all these notices being hereto attached and made a part of this report as proof of service. A personal call was also made at the homes of those whose dwelling houses abutted on these portions of road to be vacated.

That we met in accordance with the notices given, on Tuesday, June 9th., 1942, at 10:00 o'clock A. M., and proceeded to view the portions of road to be vacated. There were present the three Viewers and Mr. Springer, Secretary of the Board of Road Supervisors of the above named Township. The members of the Board of Road Supervisors had been contacted personally when acknowledgement of receiving notice of view was received and expressed themselves as being in favor of the vacating of all the portions of public road as indicated below. All the parties who live in residences abutting on the roads to be vacated were strongly in favor of vacating portions of roads in question.

Said portions of roads to be vacated are located as follows:

Portion 1. Beginning at Station 117 + 50 and ending at Station 119 + 80.

Beginning at Station 172 + 0 and ending at Portion 2. Station 177 + 80.

Portion 3. Beginning at Station 194 # 50 and ending at Station 222 + 0.

Portion 4. Beginning at Station 227 + 50 and ending at

Station 231 + 50. Beginning at Station 237 + 8 and ending at Portion 5. Station 246 + 50.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonweath," to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtanied, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view-such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefily the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

Vacating Portion of Public Road.

PETITION FOR APPOINTMENT OF VIEWERS.

TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT:

The potition of the undersigned freeholders of the Tomeship of

Last Carroll, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully repre-

aon tu :

- I. That a road has been long since laid out and opened in the fownship of East Carroll, in the County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, being known as the Dutch Road, leading from the center of Chest Creek at the Allegheny—East Carroll Township line in a northwesterly direction past the Carrolltown Borough Water Works to the Borough of Carrolltown, where the same and at State Righway Route No. 62 (Travel Route No. 219), known as the Carrolltown-Ebensburg Road. The improved portion of said Dutch Road is known as State Righway Route No. 11038, Section 2, as shown on the map attached hereto.
- 2. Said road as described in Paragraph 1 of this petition was laid out by a petition to the Court as recorded in Road Docket Vol. 2, page 438, being No. 558, and confirmed by the Court on July 7, 1860. The petition for the laying out of said road did not give a width to the same. See also Road Docket Vol. 2, page 89, No. 100, confirmed by the Court on January 11, 1851.
- 3. By reason of the improvement of said State Highway Route No. 11038, Section 2, between Station No. 107+10 and Station No. 321+0, as shown on the map attached herete and made part hereof, and by reason of the straightening of the read, taking out certain sharp curves and otherwise improving said highway, certain portions of said read as described in Paragraph 1 of this potition have become useless, inconvenient and burdensome to the taxpayers and citizens of the Township of East Carrell, and the undersigned freshelders seek to have it reseated.

4. The portions of said read sought to be vacated are described as follows, the point of beginning and the point of ending of each of said pertions being located with respect to the Pennsylvania Railroad line leading from Bradley Junction to the Borough of Patton, which said reilroad intersection the aforecald highway known as the Dutch Road, and said point of intersection being 749.6 fact from the center line of a concrete and steel bridge excessing the Chost Greek. The points of ending of each of said portions are likewise identified by their respective distances from said intersecting railwards.

(1). First Portion to be Vacated.

The point of boginning of this portion is on the center line of the above mentioned highery and is distant from said Pennsylvania Railroad line measured along said Highway 290 feet, said point of beginning being noted on the State Highway map attached hereto as Station 117-50. The point of ending of the portion to be vacated is at a point numbered Station 119-80, which is distant 280 feet from the point of beginning and is distant from said railroad intersection 580 feet.

(2) Second Portion to be Vacated.

The point of beginning of said portion to be vacated is at Station marked 172.0 on the aforesaid highest, as shown on the map attached, said point of beginning being a distance of 5760.6 feet from said intersecting railroad.

(4) Fourth Fortier to be Vacated.

The point of beginning of this perties of the real to be vasated is Station No. 227-60 on said highest as shown on said map attached, said point being distant along said highest in a northeseterly direction from the above mentioned intersecting railroad 11290.4 foot, and the place of ending of said portion is at Station 251-60 in said highest, and shown on said map attached, and is distant from said intersecting railroad 11690.4 foots

(5) Fifth Porties to be Vacated.

The point of boginning of this pertion of the read to be vacated is at Station No. 287-8 on said highway, and shown on said map hereto attached, said point being distant measured along said highway in a northwesterly direction from said intercesting railroad 12240 feet. The place of ending of said portion is at Station No. 246-50 on said highway and as shown on said map attached, and is distant measured along said highway from said intersecting railroad 18190 feet.
