

IN THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

IN THE MATTER OF THE PROCEEDINGS TO VACATE A CERTAIN  
ROAD IN THE TOWNSHIP OF GALLITZIN, COUNTY OF CAMBRIA  
AND STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of Albert Waksmonski, Thomas Gardner, and Paul T. De-lozier, respectfully represents:

1.

That your petitioners are the duly elected, qualified, and acting Supervisors of Gallitzin Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, a Township of the Second Class.

2.

That the Department of Highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in improving State Highway Route No. 36 between Ashville Borough and the Buckhorn within the boundaries of Gallitzin Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, has relocated the said highway from a point at Station 640 + 75 and extending in a westerly direction a distance of 3000 feet, more or less, to the intersection of said road to be abandoned and the new highway. Said roads are shown on the drawing hereto attached and marked Exhibit "A".

3.

That by this change of location the portion of road originally maintained as a part of the State Highway System between the stations above referred to has been abandoned as part of the system and reverted as a Public Highway to the jurisdiction of the said Township.

4.

That the portion of said road abandoned as a highway is unnecessary for public use and travel, and it will be useless, burdensome and dangerous as a roadway.

5.

That your petitioners consider it to be their duty and obligation as representatives of the Township of Gallitzin to vacate the said abandoned highway, and at a meeting duly held on March 6, 1951, passed a Resolution relative to said abandonment, a copy of which is attached hereto and marked Exhibit "B".

6.

Your petitioners therefore pray your Honorable Court to approve the abandonment of said highway and direct that this petition and Decree of Court be recorded in the Road Docket of Cambria County.

RESOLUTION

On motion of Albert Waksmonski, duly seconded and carried,  
the following Resolution was adopted:

WHEREAS, in improving State Highway Route No. 36 between Ashville Borough and the Buckhorn within the boundaries of Gallitzin Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, the said highway has been relocated from a point at Station 640 + 75 and extending in a westerly direction a distance of 1800 feet, more or less, to the intersection of said road to be abandoned and the new highway, more fully shown and described on the attached drawing.

AND WHEREAS, the Department of Highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania has served notice that by this change of location the portion of road originally maintained as part of the State Highway System between the points above referred to is abandoned as a part of the system and reverts as a Public Highway to the jurisdiction of the officials of this township.

AND WHEREAS, that portion of the State Highway originally maintained between the said stations has become useless, inconvenient and burdensome.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT, in accordance with the authority given under the Act of Assembly, approved the first day of May, 1935, P. L. 103, as amended May 2, 1949, P. L. 216, Section 110, the abandoned portion of the said road as above described be and hereby is vacated.
