Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint proper persons to view locate and lay out the same according to law. The Court upon due consideration had of the premises do order and appoint Henry Scanlan Esq. Peter Garman David Bougher A. Lieb John Fresh, and Joseph Haug who are to view the premises aforesaid and parts adjacent thereto, after being respectively sworn or affirmed according to law, to perform the duties of their appointment with fidelity, and if they or any five of them view the same and if any four of the actual viewers agree that there is occasion for ~~the~~ vacating and supplying of such road they shall proceed to locate and supply the same as agreeably to the desire of the petitioners as may be having respect to the best ground for such road and the shortest distance and in such manner as to do the least injury to private property and shall make report thereof stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for Public or Private use, together with

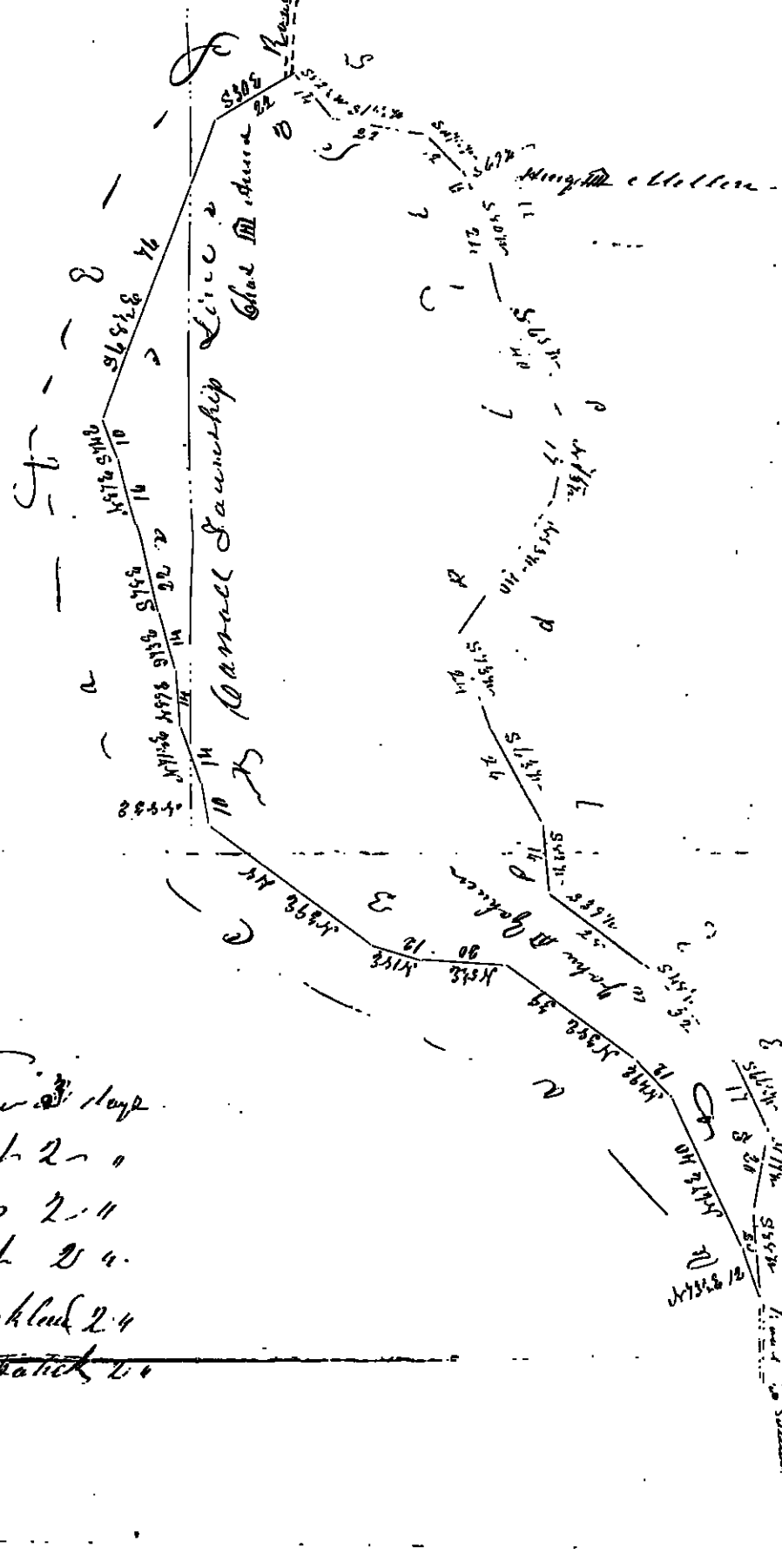

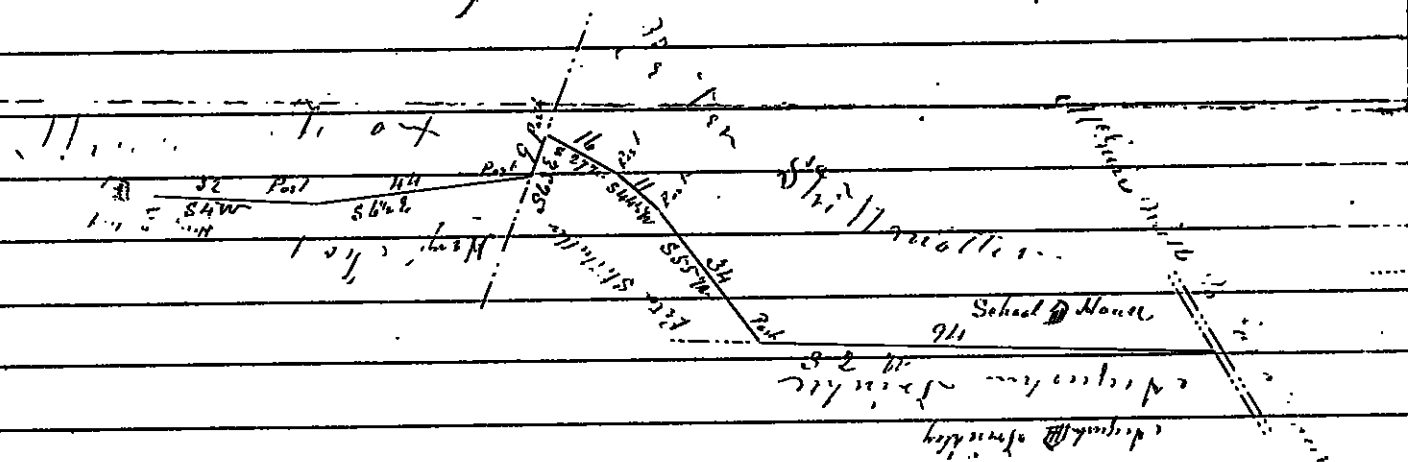

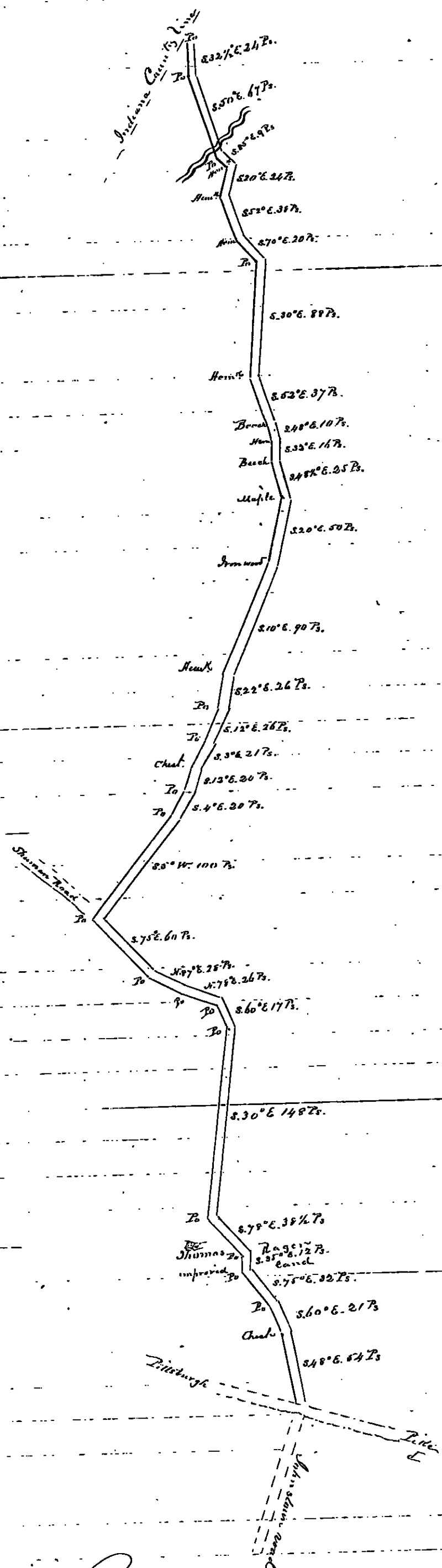
