PETITION TO CHANGE ROUTE OF ROAD

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF THE COURT OF QUARTER SESSIONS OF CAMBRIA COUNTY:

The petition of the undersigned supervisors, residents and tax payers of the Townships of Jackson and Croyle, in said County and State, respectfully represent:

FIRST. That a public road has long since been laid, opened and used in the said Townships of Jackson and Croyle, beginning at Burkhart's Corners, in said Jackson Township, and extending in a southeasterly direction about Fifteen Thousand Five Hundred and Twenty (15,520) feet in Jackson Township and one (1) mile in Croyle Township to a point where the said road intersects with a road leading from Summerhill to Wilmore; that a portion of the said described road, beginning at a point Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty (4,960) feet southeast of Burkhart's Corners and extending in a southeasterly direction two (2) miles in Jackson Township and one (1) mile in Croyle Township to a point where said road intersects with a road leading from Summerhill to Wilmore, has become inconvenient, burdensome and difficult of passage, and there would be great improvement if, instead of following the portion expressly mentioned and described above, should be vacated, and there should be supplied instead thereof a road beginning at a point on the said road leading from Burkhart's Corners to the intersection of said road and the road leading from Summerhill to Wilmore, Four Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty (4,960) Feet southeast of said Burkhart's Corners and running in a southeasterly direction to a point on the public road leading from Summerhill to the William Penn Highway 500 feet north of the point where the road leading from New Germany intersects and joins with the road leading from Summerhill to the William Penn Highway.

SECOND. That, of the new road, about one (1) mile thereof will lie

in Jackson Township and about one-half $(\frac{1}{2})$ mile thereof will lie in Croyle Township.

YOUR PETITIONERS THEREFORE PRAY THE COURT to appoint qualified persons to view the premises and to inquire into the expediency of making the said change, and otherwise proceed as directed by the Acts of Assembly in such case made and provided.

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REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sess ions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria county, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order, and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating and supplying certain portions of public road in the townships of Jackson and Croyle, said county and state, between the terminal points specifically designated in said order, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the commissioners of Cambria County and having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the Supervisors of said townships, who were present at the view, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places along the route and at or near the terminal points of the pieces of road proposed to be vacated and that proposed to be supplied; all of us met at the time and place appointed and having been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: we viewed the premises and are unanimously of the opinion that the piece of new road requested to be supplied is not necessary for the accommodation of the public and that the piece of road suggested to be vacated should not be vacated.

The piece of road proposed to be vacated, from a point 4,960 ft.

South East of the cross-roades at Burkhart's Corner takes the following courses and distances, viz; South 38° East, 494 ft.; South 53°

East 200 ft.; South 39° East 130 ft.; South 8° 30' East 280 ft.; South 34° East 260 ft.; South 56° East 496 ft.; South 8° 30' East 499 ft.;

South 4° 15' East 948 ft.; South 28° East 911 ft.; South 24° 30' East 370 ft.; South 35° East 745 ft.; South 40° 30' East 1824 ft.; Bouth 37° East 327 ft.; South 50° 30' East 1430 ft.; South 42° East 400 ft.; to the corner at the old Betz School House (now down) and continu ing South 36° East 975 ft.; South 45° 45' East 215 ft.; South 43° East

1070 ft. (crossing the line between the townships of Jackson and Croyle at 1040 ft.), and South 61° 30' East 480 ft. to the Summer-hill-Wilmore road, in Croyle township; and toe piece of road proposed to be supplied takes the following three courses and distance through and over lands of the Pennsylvania Coal and Coke Company and land of John Bodenschatz; likewise partly on each of said townships; viz; South 69° 50' East twenty six hundred thirty nine (2639) feet, South 60° 12' East forty hundred \$4fty four (4054) feet, and South 84° 15' East twenty two hundred eighty five (2285) feet, to a point on the public road leading from Summerhill to the William Penn Highway, past the farm of John Bodenschatz.

A paat or draft showing the location of the piece of road proposed to be vacated and likewise the piece of road proposed to be supplied is hereto attached and made a part of this report.

Although the portion of the present public road proposed to be vacated is in bad shape and the grade on the several hills quite steep, while the grade through and over which the proposed supply road was expected and intended to be laid out is good ground for a public road and generally of a nice grade; yet, in the opinion of the viewers, the necessity for the proposed new road, at this time, is not by any means such as would demand or justify the expendiature necessary to construct the proposed new road.

and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to deavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtanied, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
