In which report they shall state that they have been sworn or affirmed according to law.

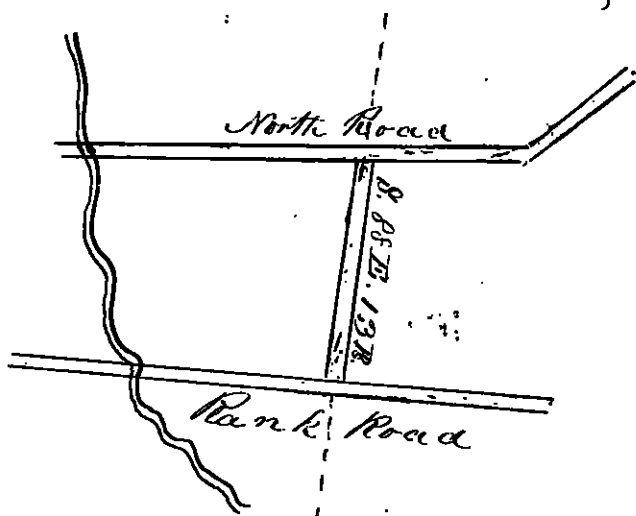
