

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court, upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the expediency of vacating and supplying the whole of portions of a public road, in White township, between the cement bridge at Dutch Run; in Beaver Valley; and Longs Cross Roads, respectfully report:-

That having given due and legal notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County and the Supervisors of White Township, and having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points and along the route of the road to be viewed; and having been first duly qualified according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our knowledge and ability: All of us met at the time and place appointed, in accord with the notices so given, and having gone over and carefully viewed the said piece of road and are unanimously of the opinion that that portion of said road lying between said cement bridge at Dutch Run, in Beaver Valley, and the St. Lawrence road, as shown on the plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report, should be vacated and that a new and wider road between said points should be supplied following the lay out of the present road substantially; except at the three places as indicated and definitely marked on said attached draft; The road as laid out and herein recommended by the viewers takes the following courses and distances, viz: Beginning at the above referred to bridge over Dutch Run thence along the present road S. 9° E. 509 ft., thence thru and over land of Harry W. Gates and Peter Gates S. 15° E. 143 ft., S. 9° W. 58 ft., S. 23° 30' W. 100 ft., S. 35° W. 122 ft., S. 24° 30' W. 164 ft. and S. 13° 30' W. 328 ft., thence along present road S. 13° 45' W. 515 ft., S. 31° W.

200 ft., S. 43° W. 413 ft., S. 28° W. 487 ft., thence thru and over land of John Stabler South 241 ft. and S. 10° 30' East 246 ft. to the present road, thence along said old road S. 20° E. 154 ft., S. 8° E. 449 ft., S. 15° W. 156 ft., S. 26° 30' W. 464 ft. to the juncture of the road leading southward eastward to the St. Augustine - Fallen Timber road at Glen Dale, thence continuing along the present old road S. 43° 30' W. 547 ft., S. 40° W. 161 ft., S. 73° W. 174 ft., N. 83° W. 387 ft., S. 82° W. 257 ft. and S. 84° 30' W. 303 ft., thence thru and over land of James McKee S. 84° 30' W. 494 ft., S. 82° W. 400 ft. and S. 81° W. 313 ft. to the present road, thence along said present road S. 44° W. 445 ft. and S. 37° W. 440 ft. to the St. Lawrence road. The remaining portion of the road ~~is~~ referred to in the attached order of the Court, from the juncture of the St. Lawrence road Southward to Long's Cross Roads, the viewers are of the opinion should not be changed at this this time.

The portions of old road recommended to be vacated take the following courses and distances, as noted on said attached draft, viz: The first beginning at point marked "A" extending S. 42° E. 156 ft., S. 13° W. 120 ft., S. 49° W. 79 ft., S. 71° W. 252 ft., S. 27° W. 70 ft. and S. 4° W. 434 ft. to point marked "B"; the second beginning at point marked "C" and extending thence S. 20° 30' W. 260 ft. and S. 31° E. 297 ft. to point marked "D"; and the third beginning at point marked "E" and extending N. 72° 30' W. 568 ft., S. 71° 45' W. 279 ft. and S. 56° 30' W. 396 ft. to point marked "F".

The viewers having failed to obtain releases of damages from the owners of property over whose land the above road was laid out and whom they consider were injured have awarded them damages as follows: To Harry W. Gates, Three Hundred Dollars; to Peter Gates, One Hundred Dollars; to John Stabler, Forty Dollars, and to James McKee, One Hundred Fifty Dollars.

At a Court of Quarter Sessions of the Peace of the County of Cambria held at Ebensburg, in the said County, on the 28th day of January A. D. 192⁴, before the Honorable Judge of the said Court: Upon the petition of divers inhabitants of the Township of White, in the said County, setting forth that they labor under inconvenience for want of a road or highway, to lead from

~~That a public road was long since laid out and opened leading from Clinton to Patton via Glendale, and usually known as the Beaver Dam Road. That a part of said road, through the Township of White in Cambria County, beginning at a point at Dutch Run Bridge, which point is 900 feet south from the road leading from Beaver Valley Church to St. Lawrence and ending at a point at Long's Cross Roads at the intersection of the road leading from the Ebensburg and Phillipsburg Pike to St. Lawrence, has become inconvenient, impracticable and burdensome by reason of numerous sharp curves and steep grades, and the said road would be very much improved by a change of its route between said points.~~

Your petitioners therefore pray the Court to appoint qualified persons to view the premises and to inquire into the expediency of making such change by vacating in whole or in part the present road and supplying the whole or part of a new road as directed by the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided:

and therefore praying the Court to appoint proper persons to view and lay out the same according to law. The Court, upon due consideration had of the premises, do order and appoint

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County, stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

The Petition of the undersigned, inhabitants of White Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania, respectfully represents:

That a public road was long since laid out and opened leading from Flinton to Patton, via Glendale, and usually known as the Beaver Dam Road. That a part of said road through the Township of White in Cambria County, beginning at a point at Dutch Run Bridge, which point is 900 feet South from the road leading from Beaver Valley Church to St. Lawrence and ending at a point at Long's Cross Roads at the intersection of the road leading from the Ebensburg and Philipsburg Pike to St. Lawrence, has become inconvenient, impracticable and burdensome, by reason of numerous sharp curves and steep grades, and the said road would be very much improved by a change of its route between said points.
