## REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of  
Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the board of viewers of Cambria county appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating and supplying a certain portion of the township road leading from Frugality to the Ebensburg-Philipsburg Pike, beginning and ending at the terminal points particularly designated on the attached order of Court, respectfully report:-

That having given due and legal notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County, to the Supervisors of the township of White, and having them accept service of notices hereto attached, and to the traveling public by printed hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places at and near the terminal points designated as aforesaid; and having been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability; All of us met in accord with the notices ~~given~~ so given and having gone over and carefully viewed the premises and are of the opinion that the piece of road laying between the ~~limits~~ termini specified in said order of court should be vacated and instead thereof a new road should be laid out and accordingly we proceeded to vacate and supply portions of road between said terminal points, as designated on the plot or draft hereto attached and made a part of this report.

The piece of road suggested to be vacated beginning on the road leading from Frugality to the Ebensburg-Phillipsburg road at the point designated <sup>and extending thence</sup> S. 76° W. 293 ft., S. 61° 15' W. 158 ft., S. 39° W. 429 ft., S. 40° 30' W. 515 ft. and S. 61° W. 226 ft. to the terminus on the road leading from St. Lawrence to the Ebensburg-Phillipsburg Pike: and the piece of road as laid out and recommended to be sup-

plied takes the following courses and distances from the point of beginning of the piece of road suggested to be vacated, viz: S. 81° W. 1005 ft., S. 74° W. 129 ft. and S. 57° W. 323 ft. to the said public road leading from St. Lawrence, passing over improved lands of John Rhyner and the Disheart Estate, ( now occupied by Herman Disheart ); from whom the viewers have been unable to secure releases of damages and have assessed the damages to John Rhyner at Eighty five Dollars and to said Disheart Estate at Five Hundred Dollars.

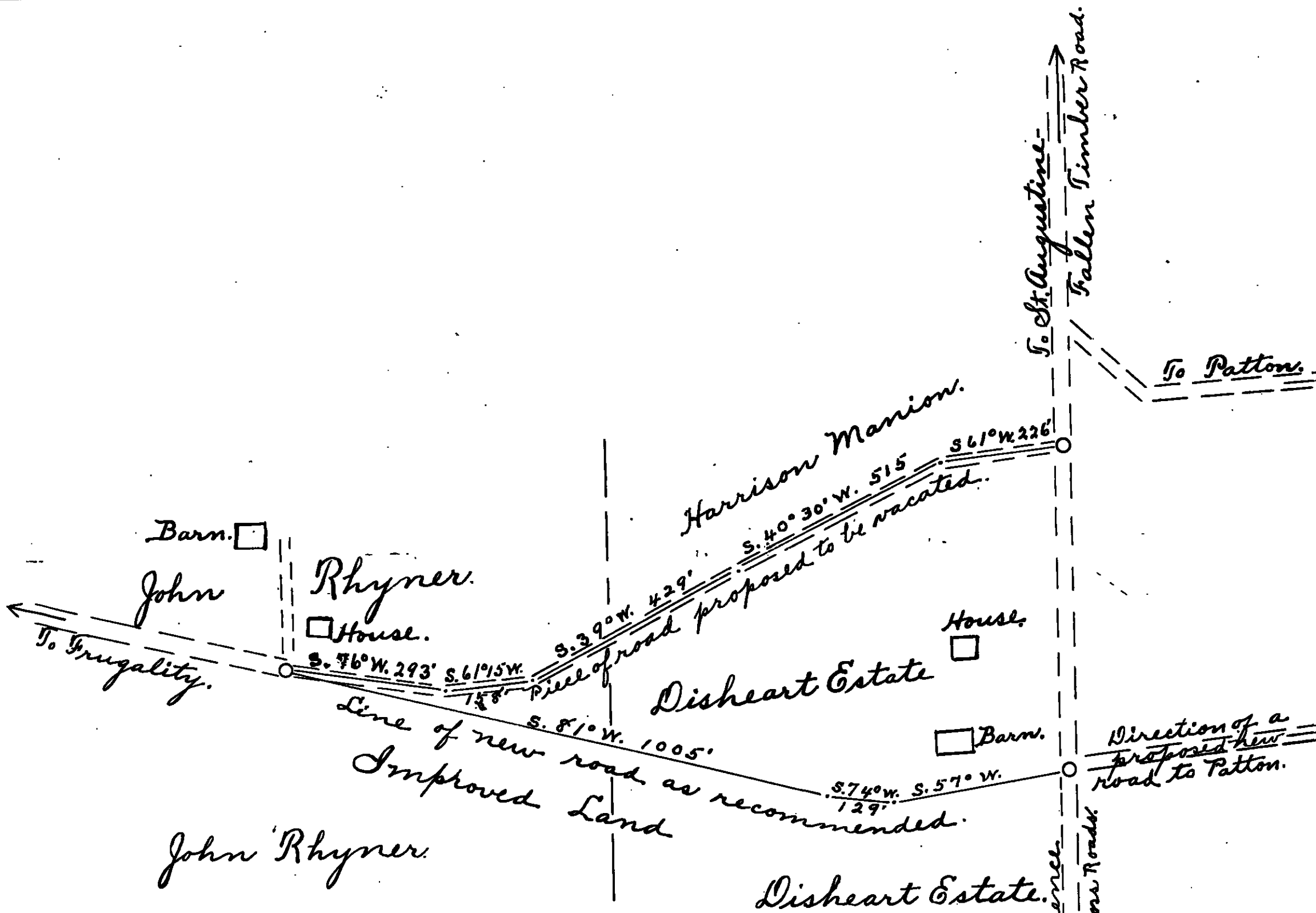

viewers, to view the ground proposed for said road, and if they view the same, and shall  
agree that there is occasion for such road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the  
shortest distance and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to  
private property, and also be as far as practicable, agreeable to the desires of the petitioners, and that  
they make a report of their proceedings to the next Court of Quarter Sessions to be held for said County,  
stating particularly whether they judge the same necessary for a public or private road, together with  
a plot or draft thereof, and the courses and distances, and references to the improvements through  
which it may pass.

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."
