Report of Viewers and Reviewers.

HEARD BEFORE EVANS, P.J., MCCANN, J., AND REE, P.J.O.C.,  
specially presiding.

OPINION BY EVANS, P.J.:— On September 18, 1924, a petition was filed asking for viewers in the above-stated proceeding. Viewers were appointed who reported on the 10th of October, 1924, in favor of a vacation of the said road. On the 2nd of March, 1925, a petition was presented asking for reviewers who were appointed and made report on the 1st of June, 1925. The two reports are before the Court now for disposition. In disposing of this matter the Court may consider the merits solely as shown upon the records. In re Road in Conoy and East Donegal Township, 7 Lancaster Law Review, 67; Ohio and Ross Township Road, 166 Pa., 132.

An examination of the report of the ~~xx~~viewers shows the following: "Some six hundred feet of the road in question accommodates one Mike Bako, living in Clearfield Township, who is not asking that the road be retained as a public road and a portion of the same road in Chest Township and extending about a half mile, comes to a blind end at the gate of one John Ryan, and accommodates him and Henry Williams, their being no other parties living along said road including that portion in

Chest Township." We learn: that a portion of this road in Chest Township was vacated some time ago, terminating at a blind point, leaving the balance of the road in Chest Township and the road in Clearfield Township beginning at a public place but ending at a private place, which leaves this clearly as a private road and not a public highway.

Examination of the report of the reviewers discloses absolutely no contradiction of these facts but on the contrary the draft accompanying the report confirms the fact that the road vacated by the viewers begins at a public highway and ends at a private dwelling house. It is well settled that a public road should have its termini in other public roads or public places and where a part thereof is vacated the part not vacated should have such termini. In re Road in Lehman Township, 7 ~~104~~ Kulp, 404. The Appellate Court decision cited in this case fully confirms the holding of the trial judge. When a road does not begin and end in a public road or public place it is not a public, but a private, road, and the reviewers should have made the same report as made by the viewers in this proceeding. The reviewers attempted to open a road which has a beginning in a public place but an ending in a private place and this may not be done under the laws of this State. We therefore enter the following

REPORT OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:-

We, the undersigned Viewers appointed by the above Court, to re-view the premises for the purpose of laying out a public road leading from Baker's Cross Roads, known as the Brick road, to the road from Patton to St. Lawrence; that a portion of said road leading from John Ryan's Lane to John Rhoad's house, was vacated all of which is in the Township of Clearfield thereby leaving a piece of public road in Chest Township, County of Cambria, aforesaid about one mile in length without any connection from said road to any other highway; respectfully report:-

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as members of the permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, as shown by the records of said Court, gave due public notice of the time and place of meeting of said Viewers by hand bills posted on the premises and by Notices served on the Commissioners of Cambria County and upon the Supervisors of the Township of Clearfield and Supervisors of the Township of Chest and upon P. J. Little, Esq., Counsel for the petitioners, all of whom accepted service at least ten days prior to the time of making of said View, evidence of which is shown by copies of said notices hereto attached and made a part of this report; that we met upon the premises according to notice given on Monday, April 6 A. D. 1925 at 1:30 o'clock P. M. for the purpose of performing the duties of our appointment.

That we Viewed the sight and locality of the road proposed to be laid out, making a personal inspection of the ground between the points designated in the petition and order. That a large number of citizens were present at the View some of whom were in favor of opening and laying out the road vacated and others for having former vacation stand.

We are of the opinion and agree unanimously that the Board of Viewers were in error in filing a report vacating a portion of this road in question entered to No. 5 September Sessions 1924. We believe that after making a personal inspection of the ground between the points designated in the petition and order that said vacation should not stand and therefore we are of the opinion and agree that said vacated public road between the points necessary be and remain open and that we authorize the laying out of a road according to the Draft hereto attached, and made a part of this report. We therefore lay out and return for public use a road, as follows:-

BEGINNING at a point at intersection of Brick road leading from Patton to St. Augustine, said point being in the center of said road and known as Baker's Cross Roads; thence from point North fifteen (15°) degrees East three hundred sixty-four and five-tenths (364.5) feet to a point the dividing line between the Townships of Clearfield and Chest, all of the said road proposed to be opened lying and being in the Township of Clearfield, the terminus of said road being the center of the road now open in Chest Township and leading to road from Patton to St. Lawrence.

We further report that we endeavored to obtain from all the owners of land upon which the said road is located releases of the damages that may arise by reason of such location, we were unable to secure releases, therefore we allowed no damages to the owners

because we considered the advantages which will accrue to their respective properties by reason of the road are equivalent to and much greater than all damages which will be sustained by them.

## REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Board of Viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the necessity or propriety of vacating a piece of public road in Clearfield Township, said county and state, between the termini specified in the said order, respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County, the Supervisors of Clearfield Township and to the traveling public by serving and posting printed hand bills in public and conspicuous places at and near the termini of the piece of road to be viewed; and having been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our knowledge and ability: All of us met, in accord with the notices so given, and having gone over and carefully viewed and are of the opinion that the piece of road as referred to in the aforesaid order is no longer necessary as a public road as it is not such as is a benefit or accommodation to the traveling public. Some 600 ft. of the road in question accomodates one Mike Bako, living in Clearfield Twp., who is not eager that the road be retained as a public road and a portion of the same road, in Chest Twp. and extending about a half mile comes to a blind end at the gate of one John Ryan and accomodates he and Henry Williams, there being no other parties living along the road, including that portion in Chest Twp. Said piece of road, a plot or draft whereof is hereto attached and made a part of this report takes the following courses and distances, viz: Beginning at the brick road, the point of beginning as specified and extending thence North 15° East 689 ft., thence North 20° East 612 ft. and North 8° East 364.5 ft. <sup>to</sup> the point of ending as designated on the attached order of Court.

Therefore we recommend that the prayer of the petitioners be ~~gr~~  
granted and the piece of public road specified in said attached order  
be vacated.

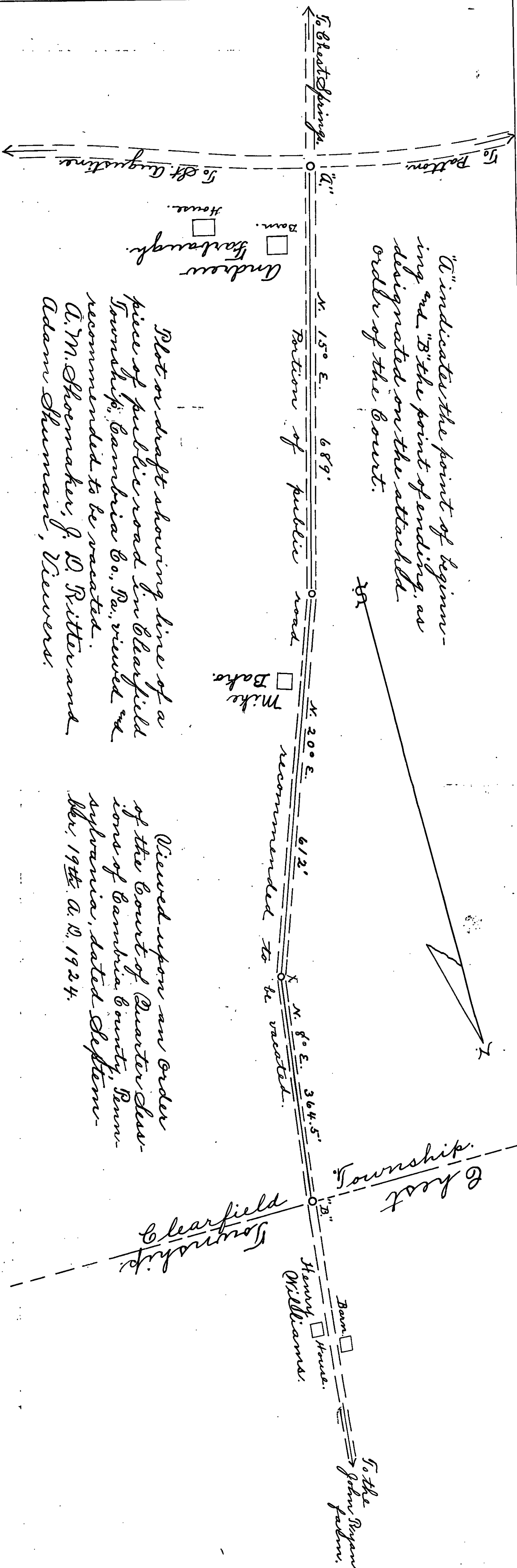

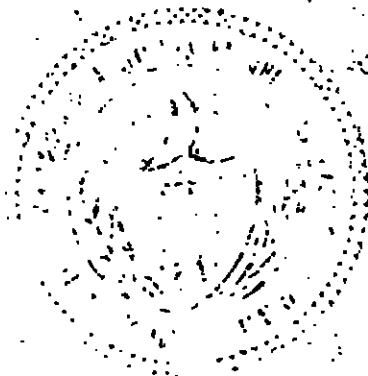

NO "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge; to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

That for upwards of thirty years a Township road was laid out and used by the public, leading from Baker's Cross Roads, known as the brick road, to the road from Patton to Saint Lawrence.

That about three years ago upon petition of the citizens of Chest Township, part of said road from John Ryans Lane to John Rhoads' house, was vacated by this Honorable Court after a report of viewers was filed.

That a petition was presented to this Honorable Court and filed to No. 5, September Sessions, 1924, whereby certain citizens of Clearfield Township, Cambria County, prayed the Court to appoint viewers to vacate all that part of said road situate in Clearfield Township. The viewers filed a report vacating the said road, thereby leaving a piece of public road in Chest Township, Cambria County, about one mile in length without any connection from said road to any other highway.

Your petitioners believe that it is detrimental to the interest of the public in Clearfield Township, Chest Township, and Patton Borough, as well as the general public throughout the State that said road be vacated.

Your petitioners therefore prays the Court to order a re-view of said road and to appoint three re-viewers, who shall not be the same persons as were appointed by the Honorable Court, to again view the road proposed to be vacated and direct that they

make a report to the next term of this Court.

And they will ever pray.
