REPORT OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:

We, the undersigned Viewers appointed by the annexed order of the above Court to view the premises for the purpose of laying out a public road leading to the Burke Cemetery, now known as the Mount Olive Cemetery, in the Township of Summerhill, beginning on the public highway known as the Frankstown Road at a point about four hundred fifty (450) feet West of the intersection of the public highway, leading from the Frankstown Road to the Borough of Wilmore, and commonly known as the "Dug Road"; thence nearly Southwest a distance of approximately four hundred eighty (480) feet to a point; thence in a Southerly direction approximately four hundred eighty (480) feet to a point; thence in a Southwesterly direction approximately four hundred eighty (480) feet to the Burke Cemetery in the Township of Summerhill, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, respectfully report:

That we were duly sworn or affirmed as members of the permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County as shown by the records of said Court; that we gave due public notice of the time and place of the meeting of said Viewers by hand bills posted on the premises and by notices served upon Commissioners of Cambria County and upon Alvin Sherbine, Esq., counsel for the petitioners, as well as upon the Secretary of the Board of Supervisors of the Township of Summerhill, all of whom accepted service at least ten (10) days prior to the making of said view, evidence of which is

shown by copies of said notices hereto attached; that we met upon the premises according to the notice given at the place of beginning of said road on Monday, July 26, A. D. 1926, at ten o'clock A. M. for the purpose of performing the duties of our appointment.

We viewed the site and locality of the road proposed to be laid out, making a personal inspection of the ground between the points designated in the petition in order, and there were present a large number of citizens. Some of the citizens were for the laying out of a road leading to the Cemetery aforesaid and others were against such laying out of road.

Because of the unusual circumstances which developed at this time, it was mutually agreed by and between all the parties and particularly the land owner one, A. W. Coleman, who was represented by Morgan W. Evans, Esq., and the petitioners that we take testimony in the matter. All parties agreed that testimony be taken before the Board of Viewers at the Court House at Ebensburg on Monday, August 23, A. D. 1926, at ten o'clock A. M. Pursuant to said agreement the Board of Viewers met at Ebensburg and heard a number of witnesses for and against the laying out of the road aforesaid. P. J. Little, Esq. appeared as Solicitor for the Board of Supervisors of the Township of ~~Summer~~<sup>Croyle</sup>hill; A. W. Coleman appeared with counsel, Morgan W. Evans, Esq., and the petitioners with Alvin Sherbine, Esq. The Supervisors of the Township of Croyle were present, some of whom were called, sworn and testified. We proceeded to hear all the testimony in the matter and there were a number of witnesses called, sworn and testified on the part of the petitioners and on the part of the exceptants. Peter J. Little, Esq., Solicitor for the Board of Supervisors of Summerhill Township, made a motion setting forth

that the Supervisors of ~~Sumner~~<sup>Croyle</sup> Township were not interested or involved in the laying out of the said road and , therefore, asked that the Supervisors be excused, which was accordingly done. After taking in consideration everything that appeared before the Board of Viewers, we are unanimously of the opinion that a public road between the termini specified in the petition should not be granted as there is a more practical way of approach into the Burke Cemetery, and that said road would incur less expense with very little damage to private property, and would be equally as convenient as the road prayed for in the petition.

We, therefore, recommend that the road as prayed for in the within petition should not be laid out. We annex hereto a plotted draft, showing the location of the road as prayed for and refused, stating the courses and distances therein.



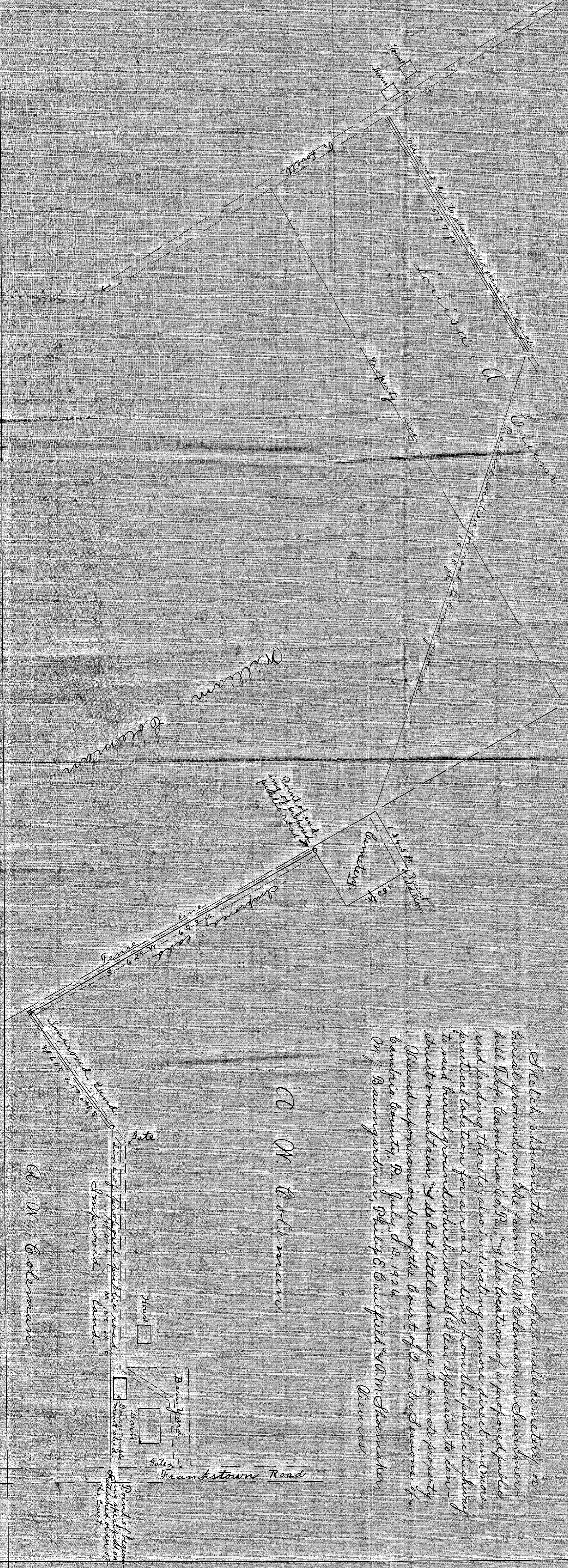

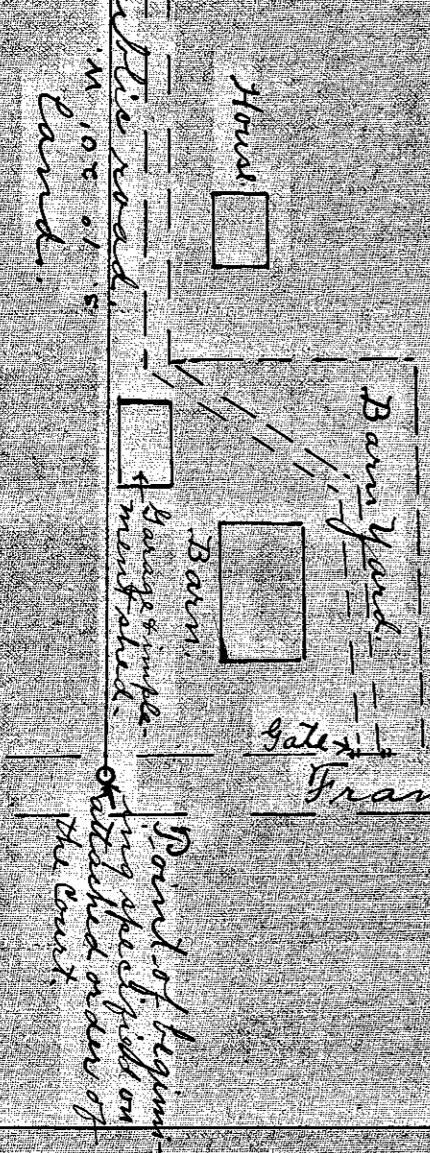

The petition of the undersigned inhabitants of the Townships of Croyle and of Summerhill, in Cambria County, respectfully sets forth:

First:

That to No. 1 June Sessions, 1926, certain citizens of Croyle and Summerhill Townships, presented their petition to your Honorable Court, setting forth that the public suffered great inconvenience for want of a public highway leading to the Burke Cemetery in Summerhill Township, and in said petition prayed for the appointment of Viewers to lay out a public road leading from a point on the Frankstown Road about four hundred fifty (450) feet West of the intersection of said Frankstown Road with the public highway leading to the Borough of Wilmore.

Second:

That pursuant to said petition, your Honorable Court appointed Viewers for the purposes mentioned in the Act of Assembly. Said Viewers met on the premises, performed their duties and made report to your Honorable Court on the 9th day of September, 1926, which said report contained the following:

"After taking in consideration everything that appeared before the Board of Viewers, we are unanimously of the opinion that a public road between the termini specified in the petition should not be granted as there is a more practical way of approach to the Burke Cemetery and that said road would incur less expense with very little damage to private property, and would be equally convenient as the road prayed for in the petition."

Third:

For said reason, the Viewers recommended that the road as prayed for should not be granted. The petitioners, therefore, allege that they are still laboring under great inconvenience for want of a public highway leading to the Burke Cemetery in Summerhill Township, and respectfully pray the Court to appoint Reviewers for the purpose of laying out a public highway leading to the Burke Cemetery between the following termini:

Beginning at a point in Croyle Township on a public highway leading from Lovett to the Frankstown Road on the westerly side of said road and about one hundred (100) feet in a northerly direction from the barn of the late S. W. Crum; thence along the line of an old abandoned private road in an easterly direction a distance of five hundred seventy-seven (577) feet to a point; thence in a northwesterly direction by a direct line a distance of ten hundred fifteen (1015) feet to the Southeast corner of the Burke Cemetery, and thence continuing around said Cemetery.
