

NOTE. "It shall be the duty of all persons appointed in the several counties of this Commonwealth to view and review any public or private road or bridge, if they shall decide in favor of locating said road or bridge, to endeavor to procure from the person or persons over whose land such location may be made releases from all claims for damages that might arise from the opening of such road or the building of such bridge; and in every case where said viewers shall fail to procure such releases, and it shall appear to them that any damages will be sustained, it shall be their duty to assess the damages and make report thereof signed by a majority of their number, and return the same, together with all releases obtained, to the Court of Quarter Sessions, and the damages so assessed shall be conclusive, or may be subject to appeal, review or modification, as may be provided by existing laws in the different counties of this Commonwealth."

"The persons appointed as aforesaid shall view such ground, and if they shall agree that there is occasion for a road, they shall proceed to lay out the same, having respect to the shortest distance, and the best ground for a road, and in such manner as shall do the least injury to private property, and also be, as far as practicable, agreeable to the desire of the petitioners."

"The viewers, as aforesaid, shall make report at the next term of said Court, and in the said report shall state particularly: First, who of them were present at the view, second, whether they were severally sworn or affirmed; third, whether the road desired be necessary for a public or private road; they shall also annex and, return to the Court a plot or draft thereof, stating the courses and distances, and noting briefly the improvements through which it may pass; and, whenever practicable, the viewers shall lay out the said roads at an elevation not exceeding five degrees (except at the crossing of ravines and streams), where, by moderate filling and bridging, the declination of the road may be preserved within that limit."

REPORT OF VIEWERS.

To the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions  
of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the permanent board of viewers of Cambria County, appointed by your honorable Court upon the attached order and therein directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating, in whole or in part, that portion of the Patton - Clearfield road lying in White Township, between Chest Township on the south and Clearfield County on the north; respectfully report:

That having given due notice of the view and of the time and place of meeting of the viewers to the Commissioners of Cambria County, the Supervisors of the Township of White and to the traveling public by serving notice on the said Commissioners and Supervisors, a copy of which with their acceptance is hereto attached and made a part of this report, and to the public by hand bills posted in public and conspicuous places near the termini and along the route of the road in question; and having each been first duly sworn according to law to perform the duties of our appointment faithfully, impartially and to the best of our judgment and ability: All of us met, in accord with the notices served and posted, as aforesaid, and having gone over and carefully observed the location, grade and alignment of the piece of road and being advised as to the present width of same, we are of the opinion that the piece of road beginning at the Clearfield County line and taking the direction "A" "B" "C" "D" "E" "F" "G", as indicated on the draft hereto attached and made a part of this report, should be vacated and the piece of road the direction of which is indicated on said draft by the letters "A" "I" "H" "E" "F" and "G" should be supplied.

The portion of road proposed to be vacated takes the following courses and distances, viz: Beginning at the Clearfield - Cambria county line and extending thence S. 33° 30' West 265 feet, South 12° East 56.5 feet, South 43° 45' East 337 feet, South 36° West 60 feet,

South 56° West 125.5 feet, South 46° 30' West 102 feet, South 26° West 141 feet, South 3° 30' West 580 feet, South 11° 40' West 551 feet, South 21° 50' West 314 feet, South 46° 45' West 114 feet, South 67° West 128 feet, South 88° West 431 feet, North 88° 40' West 141 feet, South 82° 30' West 370.6 feet, South 73° 55' West 230 feet, South 56° West 135 feet, South 37° 15' West 929.4 feet and South 54° 50' West 217 feet to the line dividing the Townships of White and Chest, and instead thereof to supply a piece of road taking these courses and distances, viz: Beginning at the Clearfield - Cambria County line and extending thence South 30° West 219 feet, South 18° West 133 feet, South 5° 50' West 133 feet, South 3° 30' West 977 feet, South 11° 40' West 551 feet, South 21° 50' West 314 feet, South 46° 45' West 114 feet, South 67° West 128 feet, South 88° West 431 feet, North 88° 40' West 141 feet, South 82° 30' West 370.6 feet, South 73° 55' West 230 feet, South 56° West 135 feet, South 37° 15' West 929.4 feet and South 54° 50' West 217 feet to the Chest township line. It appearing no injury is done & but a small amount of ordinary land taken for which the adjoiners are compensated by the improvement, we have assessed no damages.

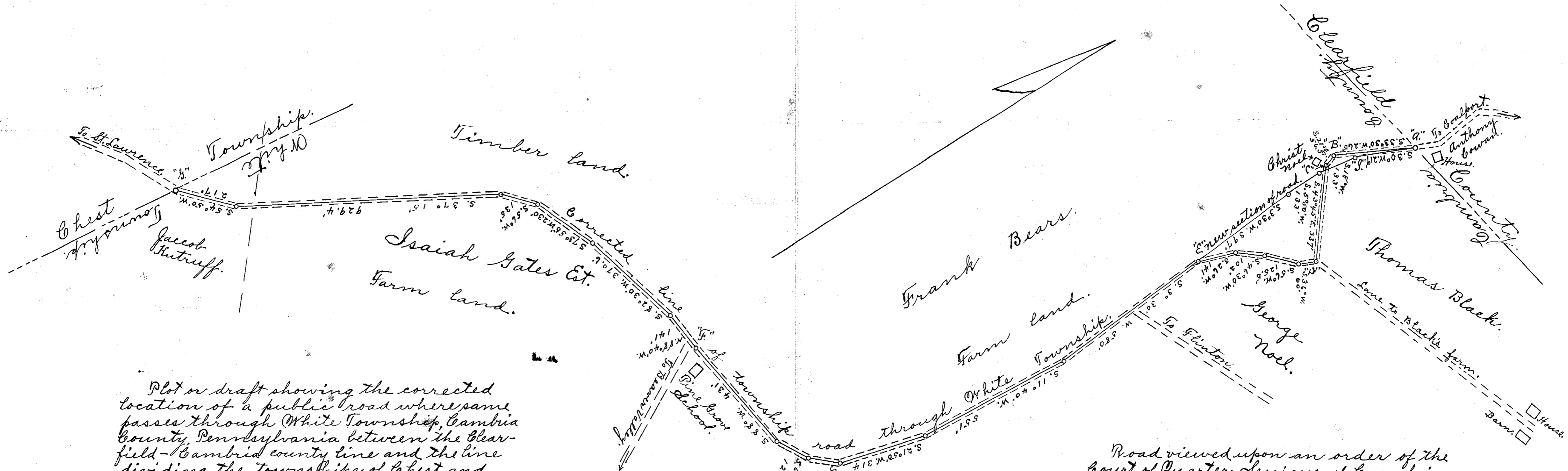

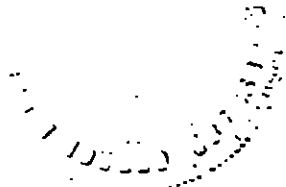
