The petition of the undersigned, the Commissioners of Cambria County respectfully represents:

- 1. That there is a section of county road located in Upper Yoder Township beginning at a point on the Cambria-Somerset line approximately one half mile east of the Cambria-Somerset-Westmoreland County line in Upper Yoder Township, Cambria County, thence northeasterly through Upper Yoder Township to an intersection with the Mencher Highway approximately one half mile south of Dalton Run, thence southeasterly to a point on the Cambria-Somerset County line approximately two miles east of the Cambria-Somerset-Westmoreland County line, a distance of about 2.3 miles.
- 2. The petition further represents that the road described here located in Cambria County is already an improved road and adjoins an improved road in Somerset County on the West.
- 3. That a part of this old turnpike which is located in Westmoreland County, about six miles in length is unimproved.
- 4. That the Commissioners of Westmoreland County have succeeded in taking this old abandoned turnpike off their county roads and placing it on the Township of Fairfield in Westmoreland County by petition to the Court of Quarter Sessions of Westmoreland County.
- 5. That your petitioners believe that the State in taking over these township roads is going to take over this turnpike as far as Westmoreland County is concerned.
- 6. That your petitioners have been informed that the State will not take over, under the Omnibus Bill, any County roads.

Your petitioners therefore pray that the portion of the turnpike which lies within Cambria County may be taken over by the Township of Upper Yoder as a Township Road with the purpose in view of having the state take over the entire road.

And they will ever pray, etc.
