

ACCEPTANCE OF PENN AVENUE
in the
VILLAGE OF JAMESTOWN, TOWNSHIP OF PORTAGE,
COUNTY OF CAMBRIA AND STATE OF PENNSYLVANIA

WHEREAS, P. J. Little laid out a plan of lots in the Village of Jamestown, Township of Portage, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, in September, 1908, as surveyed by J. Leard Elder & Son, Engineers, which plan of lots is recorded in the Recorder's Office of Cambria County in Plat. Book No. 1 at page 51, in which plan of lots a certain street, designated as Penn Avenue, was dedicated to the use of the public, and

WHEREAS, at least sixteen homes have been built and constructed along said Penn Avenue, and two halls--one used by the United Mine Workers, and the other used by a Polish Club--have also been constructed along said Penn Avenue, and

WHEREAS, a large body of citizens have made application to the Supervisors of Portage Township to accept said Penn Avenue so dedicated, and make it a part of the highway system of said township, and

WHEREAS, the Township Supervisors are of the opinion that the residents and taxpayers along said Penn Avenue are entitled to the accommodation and convenience which a maintained highway would afford:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that we, the corporate authorities of the Township of Portage, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, accept as a public road of the Township of Portage, that certain street, known as Penn Avenue, in the Village of Jamestown, Township of Portage, County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point on the Old Portage Railroad where said Penn Avenue intersects with said Old Portage Railroad at a point about six-tenths (6/10) of a mile from the point of intersection of said Old Portage Railroad and the New Portage Railroad near the boundary line between Portage Township and the Borough of Portage; thence following the line of Penn Avenue South 84 degrees East a distance of approximately 1243 feet to the point of intersection of the said Penn Avenue and the township road known as the Munster-Sonman Township Road.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That said Penn Avenue is accepted as a part of the public highway system of said township only for road purposes, and it is not intended that the township assume any responsibility for the construction or maintenance of any sidewalks along said Penn Avenue.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the width of the Street hereby accepted be fixed at twenty (20) feet for road purposes, with five (5) feet on either side remaining for the property owners to construct and maintain sidewalks.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED That the Secretary is hereby instructed to file with the Clerk of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County a ^{and attested} certified copy of this Resolution, in accordance with the Act of Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, approved the 13th day of May, A. D. 1925, P.L.673.
