REPORT OF VIEWERS.

Th the Honorable, the Judges of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

We, the undersigned members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, Pa., appointed by your honorable Court and in the attached order directed to view and determine as to the propriety of vacating a certain piece of public road in Blacklick Township, Cambria County, Pa.; between the terminii therein specified; respectfully report:
