## REPORT OF VIEWERS

To the Honorable, the Judges of the above named Court.

we the undersigned Viewers, appointed by the attached order of the Court to view the premises of the above petitioner respectfully report:-

That we have been duly sworn as members of the Permanent Board of Viewers of Cambria County, as shown by the records of the Court: That having given due public notice of the time and place of Meeting by having posted notices as required by law on and in the neithborhood of the property of said Vincent D. Huber and having served notice on the attorney for the petitioner, the County Commissioners and the Township Supervisors of Munster Township, evidenced by the endorsed copies of said notice hereto attached and made a part of this report, that we met in accordance with the notice given, on the 25th. day of May, 1937, at 10:30'clock A. M. and proceeded with the duties of our appointment and carefully examined the property to arrive at a fair estimate of its former and present situation, condition and present value.

The location and legal boundaries of the property are fully set forth in the copy of the petition filed and made a part of this report. We find that In changing the course and widening the highway a strip of the petitioner's land has been taken directly in fromt of his residence so that where he formerly had a front yard and spacious shade trees, lawn, shrubbery and fruit, there remains but a wedge shaped piece the point of which is against the front porch and while formerly the highway was practically on a level with the lawn it is now three feet lower than formerly. While the original level of the highway was about the same as the land adjoining now the cut at the western side of the Huber property is perhaps three feet and the fill and guard rail erected on the east side is perhaps five feet higher than the adjoining land and practically eliminates it for building uses. A drain from the basement of the house has been closed so that after heavy rains water rises in the cellar so that gum boots are neccessary to get up supplies. this condition is evidenced by the water line on cellar wall.

Sworn testimony, taken at the Viewers hearing on Thursday May 27th., and given by reliable and experienced witnesses as to property values established the present value of the Hoover property to be \$2,500,00 less than it was before the road was relocated.

The altered value of the property caused by the fill at the east end and the cut at the west end cannot be remedied and the lawn cannot be restored except by moving the residence back to allow room for the long task of establishing lawn, fruit and shade trees.

Being located on a curve with the right of way taken up to and practically against one end of the porch and taking into consideration the dangerous speed of traffic on this particular highway the situation now existing is a serious menace to the lives of the occupants of the dwelling.

We decided that the taking of sworn testimony was advisable and called a meeting or hearing for this purpose, notices of which are made a part of this report, on Thursday, the 27th day of May, at 9 o'clock, when we decided to award the petitioner the sum of \$1,950.00 damages.

The petition of Vincent D. Huber, respectfully represents:

That he is the owner of a truct of land situate, lying and being in the Township of Munster, County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

> Beginning at an iron pin on line of land of estate of Augustine Durbin, deceased; at a corner of land of estate of Cornelius Dever, deceased, thence by said Dever land, South 83° 33' East three hundred sixty (360) feet to an iron pin at a corner of land of W. W. Amsbry (formerly estate of Phillip Farron, deceased); thence by said land of W. W. Amsbry, South 74° 38' East twelve hundred fourteen (1214) feet to a post at a corner of land of James Noon; thence by said land of James Moon, South 3° 55' West eleven hundred forty-six (1146) feet to a post at a corner of land of Matilda Farren; thence by said land of Matilda Farren, South 4° 41' West twenty-six hundred fourteen (2614) feet to a post on line of land of estate of Patrick Connery; thence by said Connery land North 85° 50' Kest six hundred ceventy-one (671) feet to a pest at land of estate of James Durbin, deceased; thence by said Durbin land the following three courses and distances, viz: North 7° 7' East one hundred ninety-seven (197) feet to a stone, North 4° 40' East thirty-two hundred seventeen (3217) feet to a hickory, and North 86° 38' West five hundred thirty-five (538) feet to a post, at land of the estate of Cornelius Dever, deceased; thence by said Dever land Worth 5° 4' East three hundred sixty-six (266) feet to a post and North 84° 45' West three hundred sixty-eight (368) feet to a post on line of land of estate of Augustine Durbin, deceased; thence by said last mentioned land North 4° 6' East two hundred twenty-three (223) feet to an iron pin, the place of beginning. Containing 66 acres and 61 perches.

Excepting and reserving a tract of land convoyed by the petitioner to Julia Feder, by deed dated January 28, 1931 and recorded in Cambria County in Deed Book Vol. 444, at page 69, containing 40 acres, more or less.

Also excepting and reserving the coal, mining rights, and privileges, as excepted and reserved in prior conveyances.

That a public highway, known as State Highway Route No. 22, has been laid out by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania through the tract of land above described. Said highway is the main road connecting the Boroughs of Ebensburg and Cresson in the County of Cambria and State of Pennsylvania, and travels through the petitioner's land at a point near the Village of Munster, Munster Township, Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

That improvements on said highway have been made by the Department of Highways of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

4.

That as a result of the improvements so made there has been appropriated a portion of petitioner's land, being that portion directly in front of his residence. A change of grade has been made and the widening of said road has made the entrance to his home and buildings inconvenient and burdensoms. That certain valuable trees and shrubbery have been destroyed; the drainage from the house has been interfered with; a well on said premises has been destroyed; and the house on said land has been left so that the caves protrude over the right-of-way. The laws adjacent to the house has been destroyed and roots, stumps, and debris have been left on the premises.

5.

Your petitioner further avers that no compensation for this damage has been paid to him and no agreement has been made for the payment of damages between him and the County of Cambria.

WHEREFORE, your petitioner prays your Honorable Court to appoint viewers to assess the damages arising by reason of the appropriation of said land, the change of grade, and the widening of said road, as aforesaid, and report the same to your Honorable Court agreeably to the Acts

of Assembly in such case made and provided.
