132 feet to Chester Street, a dedicated Township street.
BEING a part of the Yeoman Plan of Lots of Lower Yoder
Township, which is recorded in Plat Book Vol. 2
Page 36 .

marked "Exhibit A."

WHEREFORE, your petitioner prays your Honorable
Court to give its consent to the acceptance of Yeoman Court and an unnamed



**RESOLUTION TO ACCEPT YEOMAN COURT AND
AN UNNAMED ALLEY IN THE TOWNSHIP OF
LOWER YODER**

WHEREAS, Yeoman Court and an unnamed alley at the terminal end thereof was laid out on a Plan or Plot of Lots known as the Yeoman Plan of Lower Yoder Township; and

WHEREAS, the said Plan is recorded in the Recorder's Office of and for Cambria County in Plat Book Vol. 2, Page 36; and

WHEREAS, upon the said Plan there is a street known and designated as Yeoman Court beginning at Ford Street and ending at an unnamed alley and from thence along the unnamed alley sixteen foot wide to Chester Street;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Township of Lower Yoder accepts the said Yeoman Court and the unnamed alley, which is described as follows:

BEGINNING at Ford Street and being 20 feet wide and extending westerly a distance of 289 feet to a sixteen foot unnamed alley and the Julia Turkovich property; the said alley being 16 feet wide extends northeast 132 feet to Chester Street, a dedicated Township street.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Township Solicitor be authorized to make written report thereof to be presented and filed in the Office of the Clerk of Courts of the Court of Quarter Sessions of Cambria County, Pennsylvania.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of Assembly in such case made and provided, that any citizen or freeholder of the Township may, within thirty days after the filing of the report of the Supervisors, file exceptions to the report, together
