## REPORT OF THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF LILEY BOROUGH AND THE SUPERVISORS OF WASHINGTON TOWNSHIP

TO THE HOMORABLE, THE JUDGE OF THE ABOVE NAMED COURT, AND TO ALL OTHER PERSONS CONCERNED:

The undersigned Officers of the Borough of Lilly and the Township of Washington, respectfully reports:

- l. They are the Borough Council men of Lilly Borough and the Road Supervisors of the Township of Washington, County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania.
- 2. That they propose to lay out, open and accept a public road lying partially in the Borough of Lilly and Partially in the Township of Washington, County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania, more particularly described as follows:
  - No. 1. Beginning at a point on the center line of Piper Street. Said point of beginning being S 650-18' E 346.85 feet from the intersection of the center line of Fiper Street with the western Right-of-Way line of Harris Street. Thence from said point of beginning by a line at right angles to the center line of Piper Street, N. 240-42' E 16.50 feet to a point, said point being on the northwesterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street as extended, thence along said Right-of-Way line S  $65^{\circ}$ -18' E 42.72 feet to a point, said point being the point of curvature of a curve to the left. Said curve having a delta angle of 90°-10' and a radius of 129.69 feet, an arc length of 204.09 feet, a chord bearing of N  $69^{\circ}$ -37' E, and a chord distance of 183.68 feet to a; point, said point being the P.T. of said curve. Thence along said Right-of-Way line N 240-32' E 22.20 feet to a point on the southwesterly Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad. Thence along and upon the Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad S 65°-28' E 33.00 feet to a point, said point being on the southeasterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street as extended. Thence along and upon the southeasterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street as extended), S 240-32' W 22.20 feet to a point, said point being the point of curvature of a curve to the right, Said curve having delta angle of 90°-10' and a radius of 162.69 feet, an arc length of 256.03 feet, a chord bearing of S 690-37' W, and a chord distance of 230.41 feet to a point. Thence along said Right-of-Way line N 650-18' E 42.72 feet to a point. Thence N:240-42' E 16.50 feet to the point and place of beginning.

Said parcel of ground containing 0.223 acres.

The above described parcel of land is shown on the plan attached hereto and made a part hereof.

No. 2. Beginning at the intersection of the center line of Piper Street extended and the northeasterly Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad. Said point of beginning being located by the following two courses and distances from the intersection of Piper Street with the western Right-of-Way line of Harris Street S 65°-18' E 536.19 feet and N 24°-32' E 228.82 feet.

Thence from said point of beginning by a line at right angles to the center line of Piper Street and along the Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of The Pennsylvania Railroad, N 65°-28' W 16.50 feet to a point, said point being on the northeasterly Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad, also on the northwest Right-of-Way line of Piper Street extended, and the point of curvature of a curve. Thence by the arc of a curve to the right and by the lands now or formerly of Leslie Piper, said curve having a delta angle of 120°00', a radius of 88.09 feet, an arc length of 184.50 feet, a chord bearing of N 84°-32' E, and a chord distance of 152.58 feet to a point, said point being the point of tangency of said curve. Thence continuing along lands now or formerly of Leslie Piper and the north Right-of-Way line of Piper Street extended S 38°-28' E 1.74 feet to a point, said point being the point of curvature of a curve. Thence by the arc of said curve to the left along land now or formerly of Leslie Piper, said curve having a delta angle of 30°00' and a radius of 316.62 feet, an arc length of 165.78 feet, a chord bearing of S 50°-28' E, and chord distance of 163.89 feet to a point said point being the point of tangency of said curve.

Thence from said point S 240-38' W 53.00 feet to a point on the southeasterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street extended and the northeasterly Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad. Said point being the point of curvature of a curve, to the right. Said curve is the southeasterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street extended. Thence by the arc of said curve and along land now or formerly of Leslie Piper, said curve having a delta angle of 30°00' and a radius of 349.62 feet, an arc length of 183.06 feet, a chord bearing of N 50°-28' W, and a chord distance of 180.98 feet to a point, said point being the point of tangencyhof said curve. of Thence from said point, along and upon the southeasterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street extended, and along land now or formerly of Leslie Piper N 350-28' W 1.74 feet to a point, said point being the point of curvature of a curve. Thence by the arc of a curve to the left and along lands now or formerly of Leslie Piper, said curve having a delta angle of 120000 a radius of 55.09 feet, and an arc length of 115.38 feet, a chord bearing of S 840-32' W, and a chord distance of 95.42 feet to a point, said point the point of tangency of said curve and on the north easterly Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad.

Thence from said point along and upon the northeasterly Right-of-Way line of the Lilly Branch of the Pennsylvania Railroad N 650-28' W 16.50 feet to the point and place of beginning.

Said parcel of ground containing 0.247 acres.

The above described parcel of land is shown on the plan attached hereto and made a part hereof, and marked Exhibit "A".

3. The Borough Council of Lilly Borough at a regular meeting held the 26 day of August, 1961 and the Supervisors of Washington Township at a special meeting on the 26 day of August, 1961, upon hearing, decided in favor of ordaining the laying out, opening and accepting of the above described road as a public road in the Borough of Lilly and the Township of Washington, the

respective ordinance of the Borough of Lilly and the Township of Washington are here to attached, made a part hereof, and marked Exhibit "B" and Exhibit "C".

- 4. That the aforesaid petitioners have waived all right to damages and the right of any notice of the time and place of hearing in the matter of laying out, opening and accepting said road.
- 5. That the Borough Council of Lilly Borough and the Supervisors of Washington Township believe that the laying out, opening and accepting of said road is necessary for the public convenience.
- 6. That this report and survey attached hereto is made and filed in the Office of the Clerk of Quarter Sessions pursuant to the Act of Assembly of May 4, 1927, P.L. 519, as amended, and Act of Assembly of May 1, 1931, P. L. 101, as amended.

## OPENING STREET - PIPER STREET EXTENSION

An Ordinance laying out, opening and adopting as a public street in the Borough of Lilly, a street to be designated as Piper Street Extension, and fixing and regulating the width and grade thereof.

The Borough of Lilly hereby ordains as follows:

Section 1. The following street is hereby designated as Piper Street Extension, is hereby laid out, opened and ordained as a public street in the Borough of Lilly. All the portions of the following described parcels of land which are situate within the corporate limits of the Borough of Lilly, County of Cambria, and State of Pennsylvania, bounded and described as follows:

No. 1. Beginning at a point on the center line of Piper Street. Said point of beginning being S 650-18' E 346.85 feet from the intersection of the center line of Piper Street with the western Right-of-Way line of Harris Thence from said point of beginning by a line at right angles to the center line of Piper Street, N. -42' E 16.50 feet to a point, said point being on the northwesterly Right-of-Way line of Piper Street as extended, thence along said Right-of-Way line S 65°-18' E 42.72 feet to a point, said point being the point of curvature of a curve to the left. Thence along said Right-of-Way line N 65°-18' E 42.72 feet to a point. Thence N 24°-42' E16.50 feet to the point and place of beginning.
