Report of Viewers

We, the undersigned, viewers appointed by the within Order of Court to vacate and supply the road in the Order mentioned, respectfully report: That having been first severally sworn and affirmed, we met upon the premises, being the line of the road on the Thirteenth day of April A.D. 1896 first having given notice by hand bills, as required by the statute, of the time and place of meeting, proceeded to make the view and are of the opinion that the said road in part should be vacated and supplied that we herewith attach a draft, showing the parts of the road vacated and supplied in accordance with the provisions of the law, we obtained a release from Conrad Yehmer for the portion of the road passing through his land, and requested all the other property holders and owners, to execute releases. None others were executed. We therefore estimated the damages and advantages to the several property holders and owners along the line of the road and find the damages and advantages are equal; that no property holder on the line of the road has sustained damage by the laying out and opening of the road beyond the advantages accruing to him or them. The line of the road as laid out to be opened to supply the parts vacated is as follows: Beginning at the Post at the junction of the Salix Road and the private Road of Conrad Yehmer, thence in said private South $22\frac{3}{4}^{\circ}$ east fifty one (51) rods to a post thence through land of Conrad Yehmer South forty nine (49°) east forty seven (47) rods to a Sugad, thence through the same North eighty and one fourth ($80\frac{1}{4}^{\circ}$) degrees east seven (7) rods to a post thence North seventy five (75°) degrees East seventeen & six tenths ($17\frac{6}{10}$) rods to a Post, thence through land of the Henriette Coal & Coke Company, North forty three (43°) degrees east nine & six tenths ($9\frac{6}{10}$) rods to a post thence through the same North thirty (30°) degrees east fifteen (15) rods to a Post thence through the same North Fourteen (14°) degrees east fifteen (15) rods to a post in said Salix & Davis Road, thence supplying 109 rods of said road to a post opposite the old watering trough, thence through the land of Henriette Coal Co South (36°) thirty six degrees east sixteen (16) rods to a Post thence South fifty seven & one half ($57\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$) degrees east twenty (20) rods to a Post thence South forty one (41°) degrees east twenty (20) rods to a post thence North seventy three (73°) degrees east seven rods to a Beech tree, thence North twenty six (26°) degrees east thirty one & six tenths ($31\frac{6}{10}$) rods to a post in the Salix & Davis Road near the Barn of Gyo Hoff formerly James Coalow's aid road to be thirty three (33) feet wide. We therefore respectfully report in favor of the vacation of so much of the road as is shown on the draft marked vacated and the laying out and opening of that portion of the road shown on the map or plot, and marked "to be opened" all of which is respectfully submitted. All the viewers were present and concur in this report

We, the undersigned, appointed by the annexed order, do report; that in pursuance thereof, after having been severally duly sworn or affirmed, all the viewers appointed by said order, viewed the ground proposed for within mentioned road and the undersigned viewers do agree that there is occasion for a road, as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for the public road, as desired by the petitioners, and that the same is necessary for the public road. D. 1898, at 10 o'clock, A. The notices required by law were duly given; that is to say, not less than ten (10) typewritten notices of the time and place where said Viewers were to meet for the purpose of viewing said road, were posted in the most public places and at different points along and in the vicinity of the ground to be viewed more than ten (10) days before the time of such meeting, a copy of said notice is hereto annexed and marked Exhibit "A". In pursuance of said order, the undersigned viewed the site and locality of the road proposed to be changed, making a personal inspection of the ground between the points designated in the petition and order on the day above mentioned, and a survey of the same showing the courses and distances and noting the improvements along the line of the same was made by Charles L. Horner, one of the said Viewers, a draft of which survey is hereto annexed and marked Exhibit "B".

Report of Viewers.

The undersigned viewers named in the within order respectfully report:

1. That we met at the time and place specified in the notice to meet on the 23d day of November, A.D. 1899, at 8:30 A.M. at the dwelling house of Leonard Sherly, in Adams township, as required by the notice.
2. The notice required by law was duly given, that is to say, six days prior in writing to John G. Gates, clerk of the County Commissioners and notice in writing to Samuel Jones, Samuel Shantz and H. W. C. 




